Cub Air Flight School

Cub Air Flight School is located at Hartford Municipal Airport. Through the Aviation Club, students can receive a 50% discount on flight lessons to obtain their pilot's license. KMYA has it's own J-3 Cub airplane for use by students.



Rare Opportunity

HUHS and Kettle Moraine Youth Aviation, Inc. have teamed up to offer a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to build this RV-12 aircraft. Through participation in the Aviation Club you will be learn how to rivet, measure, cut, bend and shape aluminum into a real aircraft. The RV-12 seats two, and cruises at 130 mph. It is capable of traveling up to 500 miles non-stop. When completed the plane will be available for students to fly if they choose to obtain their pilot's license.

The building process is a TEAM endeavor, and through hands on experience you will learn to read plans, measure, organize and work with others in a collaborative way to achieve an ambitious goal: Building and flying a real aircraft! We also recently were gifted a 1941 J-3 Cub to use for flight lessons.
