
Enrollment Projection

Cohort Survival Method



Special Education Expenditure History - Per ED001/EFS





Per Pupil Expenditure

2018 -19 Net Current Expenditure (NCE) Per Pupil (NCEP)



 - o Increase FTE from .4 to 1.0 FTE
- > District Security Specialist (District-wide)
 - Addresses need to increase support of district's comprehensive security plan
 - Ensures consistency and efficacy for district-wide security initiatives
 - Allows one person to oversee and maintain a district-wide safety program involving building safety systems
 - Provides stability in coordinating district collaborative efforts with municipal agencies for inspections, CIRMA visits, and the development of emergency plans


















2018-2019 Impressive Data - NGSS


