NWEA MAP Testing Info

- MAP stands for Measures of Academic Progress and is a standardized test that provides information on academic skills students have acquired during a school year.
- Our students take the test in Reading three times a year (Fall, Winter, Spring) and twice a year in Math (Fall, Spring).
- Students will then be placed in reading groups to receive targeting instruction to develop and increase their reading skills.



Instructional Model

Arrival: Student arrival time every day is 7:50am and may enter through Door #5. Students are marked tardy by 8:05am. Parents can only enter the building with a parent I.D. For all tardy students, please sign in at the main office door.

Dismissal: Student dismissal begins at 3:30pm. Students will dismiss out of Door #5 (Kindergarten dismissed out of cafeteria doors). Please make sure that you complete the emergency contact form with current information.

Late Pick Up: Late pick up begins 15 minutes after dismissal. All K-5 students are required to remain in the building after dismissal for safety reasons. Late pick up students are held in the cafeteria and parents are charged a \$20.00 late pick up fee.

Enrichment Program: Enrichment is offered before and after school. The annual registration fee plus one week's tuition must be paid in advance for your child to attend and participate in the enrichment program. Applications can be obtained from the main office.
