Glazer this Fall

All students will continue to be in-person learning in school! Students will be required to attend school in person for the entire school day.

We will continue the following changes from last year including masks are **REQUIRED** by all Staff and Students. The use of desk shields, social distancing stickers and signage throughout the building. Signs on how to wear masks in the building. Signs on how to wash hands in bathrooms. Sanitizing stations throughout the building and sanitizing of classrooms by hand steam machine.

Technology will be passed out again this Fall. Also, we will continue utilizing the Google Classroom to support work some classwork assignments as well as homework such as SFA Read and Respond and C3/math homework.



Character Camp

The first two weeks of school is crucial in creating a strong culture. Teachers will be focusing this time practicing classroom and school wide procedures with scholars. As well as working on team building and character-building activities in order to build a caring and cooperative classroom environment to ensure success academically and socially.

Student Attendance

Good attendance is very important. It is imperative that students are at school daily and on time! Student performance is greatly affected by their ability to be in class daily and mentally present. Please work with Glazer in giving your student the opportunities possible by being in class on time daily. School hours are from 8:00-3:30. Students are tardy after 8:05. Our Glazer values by being on time! We need our students in school every day ready to learn. Thank you for supporting a positive lifelong habit! When students are absent, please make sure your scholar completes all make up work. Scholars have the same number of days to complete the work that they were absent. Even if your child is out for an extended period of time, we will work together to get the work completed after he/she returns to school. If your student is absent please call the school at 313-852-1500. Please send a letter or doctor's excuse to school. Any student being picked up early must be signed out by an approved adult who must show I.D. Remember our goal is to reduce our chronic absenteeism by 15% from 45% to 30% and to increase our average daily attendance from 83% to 96%!

Parent Resources Why Kids need Routines

Routines are how families organize themselves to get things done, spend time together and have fun. Every family has its own unique routines. Routines help family members know who should do what, when, in what order and how often. For example, your family might have:

* daily routines for getting everyone ready in the morning, bath time, bedtime and mealtimes, greetings and goodbyes.

* weekly routines for housework, like washing and cleaning other routines.

Family life might be more chaotic without some routine, but there's more to it than that. Routines also let your children know what's important to your family. This also holds true for students in school! Classrooms must have routines and procedures to ensure that students know what is expected of them and how operate within the structure of school.

* Routines can eliminate power struggles.

*Routines help kids cooperate by reducing stress and anxiety.

*Routines help kids learn to take charge of their activities.

NWEA

Glazer scholars will be taking the Measures of Academic Progress or MAP. It creates a personalized assessment experience by adapting to each student's learning level - precisely measuring student progress and growth for each individual. Teachers will have essential information about what each student knows and is ready to learn within 24 hours and thusly be able to use it to inform instruction. Testing occurs three times per year and begins within the first weeks of September.

MSTEP

The MSTEP (Michigan State Test of Educational Progress) is the state assessment taken by all students in 3rd-8th grade and 10th graders across the state. It is a summative evaluation to gauge how students are mastering the state standards. This assessment is taken once yearly in the spring.

ANET

The ANET Assessment is a formative assessment used to determine how students are also mastering the standards and they are taken quarterly.



Assessment

Teachers at Glazer are assessing student Mastery on an ongoing basis. Teachers also use formative and summative assessments to inform instruction to achieve maximum student achievement.

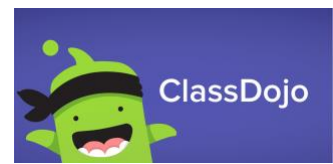

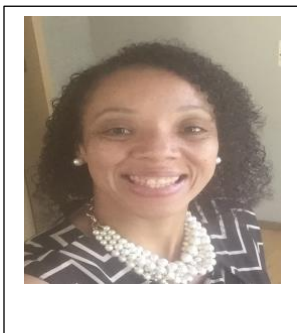
