

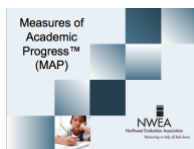

NWEA TESTING

This week our scholars will be testing an assessment called Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) which is a product from Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA). This test is required by the state of Michigan and our authorizers.

The MAP is a computerized adaptive assessment. The assessment is built for each student as they are taking it based on correct or incorrect answers selected. If a student gets a question incorrect, the next questions from that goal area will be easier. The test is built in such a way that the student will not know the answer to all of the questions.

MAP has the ability to measure a student’s achievement and academic growth, independent of grade, across time. From the insight provided with MAP and its reports, we can compare class or grade level performance to students from a wide variety of schools across the country.

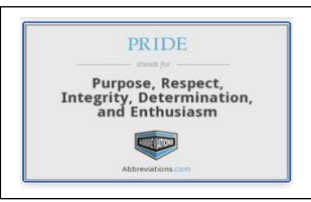

Good attendance is very important. It is imperative that students are at school daily and on time! Student performance is greatly affected by their ability to be in class daily and mentally present. School hours are from 8:00-3:30 this week forward. One of our Glazer values is being on time! Remember students are tardy after 8:05. We need our students in school every day ready to learn.

Remember our goal is to reduce our chronic absenteeism by 15% from 45% to 30% and to increase our average daily attendance from 83% to 96%!

Hello Families!!! My name is Korree Baker and I am the Student Support Specialist here at New Paradigm Glazer Academy. I started at Loving Academy in August 2011 after dedicating 10 years to Detroit Public Schools as a High School English teacher, Yearbook Sponsor, and teacher of Public Speaking. I realized my love for educating students while I studied Language Arts and Communications with a concentration in Secondary Education at Adrian College. Working with high school students allowed me to see how students struggled because at the elementary or middle school level, they weren't taught foundational skills, or they didn't retain the foundational skills they were taught, or circumstances in their home life, made it difficult for them to acquire all of the foundational skills that were needed to be successful at the High School level. It was because of that experience that I was dedicated in my role as a paraprofessional, then Interventionist, when I joined New Paradigm. As I enter my 7th year as Student Support Specialist, I work with a team of educators to determine the barriers that prevent students from being successful academically, behaviorally, and socially. As we identify those barriers, we create interventions that are solution based, goal oriented, and involves partnering with students, parents, families, and community partners to ensure the overall well-being of our students. With that being said, I can't imagine myself working with any other group of students, families, or community.



Attendance Works

Help Your Child Succeed in Preschool and Kindergarten Build the Habit of Good Attendance

DID YOU KNOW...

Showing up on time every day is important to your child's success and learning from preschool forward.

Missing 10% of school (1 or 2 days every few weeks) can make it harder to:

- Gain early reading and math skills.
- Build relationships.
- Develop good attendance habits.

High quality preschool and kindergarten has many benefits!

- The routines your child develops will continue throughout school.
- Make the most of early grades by encouraging your child to attend every day.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Work with your child and his/her teacher to develop your child's strong attendance.

Talk about it – sing about it – make it an adventure!

- Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Share ideas with other parents for getting to school on time.

Before the school year starts

- Find out what day school starts and begin a countdown!
- Keep your child healthy and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Attend orientation with your child to meet teachers and classmates and find out about health and safety procedures.

Ready, Set, GO!

- If you are concerned your child may have Covid-19, call your school for advice. Ask for resources to continue learning at home if needed.
- Ask family members or neighbors for assistance if you need help.
- Try to schedule non-Covid-19 medical appointments and extended trips when school is not in session.
- If your child seems anxious about preschool or kindergarten, talk to the program director, teacher, your doctor or other parents for advice.
