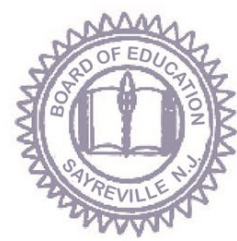

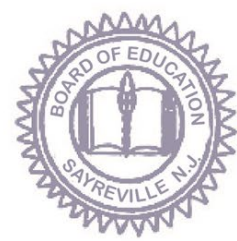


students made their own food props for their new Grocery creative play theme. Likewise, students at
