Sheltered Instruction

Sheltered courses deliver the grade-appropriate curriculum (English 1-4) in a vocabulary- rich environment that supports emergent bilinguals (EBs) in developing content and English language proficiency.

- English is the language of instruction in sheltered classes.
- Primary language support is allowed to assist students in understanding the content.
- Students must be recommended for sheltered classes by the Language Proficiency Assessment Committee (LPAC).



Personal Financial Literacy

The Personal Financial Literacy TEKS are included in a variety of current course and will be included in its entirety with the proposed Economics/Personal Financial Literacy course.

Enrollment: Fall22 is **141** and SPR23 is **125** or **3.08%** of HS students
