
A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

After two COVID-impacted academic cycles, what a tremendous school year our King gave us! With His help in 2021-2022, The King's Academy:

- Completed a return to normal school year with field trips, fans, gatherings, travel, and no masks.
- Celebrated 53 first-time decisions for Christ and hundreds of rededicated lives growing in faith.
- Educated 1,450 students on the main campus and more than 100 preschoolers remotely.
- Built the Frank DiMino Student Union and began construction on the Esther B. O'Keeffe Innovation Center.
- Graduated 144 seniors headed to Stanford, Notre Dame, UNC, Vanderbilt, UCLA, UF, FSU, UM and many other Christian and highly selective colleges and universities in the fall.
- Established The King's Online Academy, a King's-developed, accredited, diploma-granting online high school backed by TKA curriculum and teachers.
- Hosted Tim Tebow, Bob Goff, J. Warner Wallace, Darryl and Tracy Strawberry, Dallas Jenkins, and other gifted speakers.
- Recognized the renaming of the Smith Family Café and Bistro by Ms. Jan Smith.

- Premiered Studio 70's award-winning first feature, *The Fountain of Youth*, and unveiled its first *Star Wars* fan project (*Gray Trials*), filmed using the new LED wall.
- Donated more than 25,000 hours to charitable causes in Palm Beach County and beyond.
- Completed eight new homes with Hope Project International, including King's 50th and 51st houses for Guatemalan and Nicaraguan families.
- Returned to trips and retreats in Hawaii, Alaska, Washington DC, Atlanta, St. Augustine and more.
- Drove 400,000 miles, transporting TKA students safely across Palm Beach County and beyond.
- Earned a Silver Play Button for 100,000 subscribers on the TKALionheart YouTube channel and was ranked 2nd Best High School Channel by Feedspot, the first brick and mortar K-12 school on its global Top 30 list.
- Maintained a balanced budget while investing in students, employees, facilities, equipment, and technology to keep King's on the cutting edge for years to come.

FAITH AND WORSHIP ... THIS IS TKA!

This school year proved to be one of rare opportunities. **Middle and high school students heard from some of the best speakers and nationally recognized authors of our day** including **Bob Goff**, author of the *New York Times* bestseller *Love Does*, **Alisa Childers**, a former Christian contemporary music artist, apologist, and author, and **J. Warner Wallace**, a former homicide detective, apologist, and author of *Cold-Case Christianity*. **Dallas Jenkins**, creator and director of *The Chosen* television series, and **Darryl Strawberry**, former major league baseball player for the New York Mets and Yankees and his wife **Tracy Strawberry**, shared testimonies during spiritual emphasis chapels.

In response to the Russian invasion of Ukraine, an impromptu prayer service was hosted. More than 100 members of the TKA Family gathered to lift up those affected and to pray for peace. Subsequently, a fundraiser was set up to benefit Samaritan's Purse and Convoy of Hope, two organizations providing front-line aid to Ukrainians. **The King's Academy student body donated more than \$30,000!**

Quarterly Nights of Worship were established and provided a growing opportunity to worship together as a community and supplied a platform for students to share encouraging messages. **One80** and **3:16 Bible study groups** gave time to embrace God's Word. **Weekly chapels** and spiritual life events and class retreats created opportunities for students to strengthen their

faith and build lasting relationships. Daily **Bible classes** and **King's Christian Leadership Program of Distinction** also provided spiritual and academic training.

In elementary, weekly chapels planted seeds of truth about the character of God and how He wants His children to live. **Four TKA seniors shared their experiences** and encouraged our elementary students in matters of faith. **Third, fifth, and sixth graders planned and ran several chapels** in the spring. King's began using **Deep Roots Bible curriculum** this year and there is no doubt the Lord is using it to nurture and grow the hearts of TKA's youngest students. **Spiritual development** is also happening outside of the classroom in mentoring groups, redemptive discipline, on the athletic fields, in the choir room, on stage, in the café, and on overnight trips. We pray that these young lives will be forever changed for their good and His glory.

At The King's Academy, academic excellence is a top priority for its outstanding faculty. Its academic administration, led by Headmaster and Vice President Dr. Douglas Raines, is committed to providing the teachers and students with every tool necessary for academic success.

The Class of 2022 certainly took advantage of every opportunity as more than 50 percent of seniors taking the SAT earned a 1300 or higher on the standardized college entrance exam. Those taking the ACT also excelled with more than half the class earning a 29 or higher. These results easily exceed national and Florida norms, demonstrating the value of a TKA education.

In 2022, The King's Academy's graduating class also placed TKA among the nation's elite by:

- Earning an **85 percent Advanced Placement passing rate**.
- Being awarded more than **\$10.5 million in scholarships**, an average of \$73,000 per graduate.
- Achieving **100 percent college acceptance** by all 144 seniors.

During their academic careers, the Class of 2022 also benefitted from King's **extensive Program of Distinction offerings in Aviation, Business, Christian Leadership, DiMino Engineering and Technology, O'Keeffe Pre-Law Studies, Pre-Medical, and Smith Family Conservatory of the Arts**. With these academic advantages and the addition of the **Frank DiMino Student Union** and **Esther B. O'Keeffe Innovation Center** to TKA's campus, it's not

surprising that most TKA grade levels reached waitlist status this summer.

So, what's a premier academic school with tremendous demand to do to make its learning programs available to more students? Why not introduce a robust online high school with more than 70 classes, developed and supported by King's outstanding faculty members? That's exactly what The King's Academy did this year, **rolling out The King's Online Academy for summer and fall 2022 and beyond**. Led by Jennifer Ceppo, Director of Innovation and Non-Traditional Learning, with its development costs fully underwritten by generous donors, TKOA offers students worldwide the opportunity to earn a fully accredited TKA diploma while taking a full slate of academic and TKA Program of Distinction classes (see page 69 for TKOA's offerings). The NCAA Clearinghouse also recognizes TKOA as an approved school for future college athletes. With the inauguration of TKOA, it is The King's Academy's hope and prayer that its mission of "graduating Christian leaders" will expand worldwide.

The success of TKA's academic program, both in-person and online, is reflected in the continuing admissions to and success of graduates at top colleges and universities. The King's Academy's leadership remains committed to ensuring that core academic rigor is not compromised by "flavor of the month" programming as specialized programs and online offerings add to, rather than take away from, the overall academic focus of the school.

In recent years, an increased investment of financial, capital, and personnel resources has resulted in an accelerating number of athletic honors and trophies; with nearly 70 postseason titles in the past six years. While these victories are sweet, The King's Academy doesn't invest in sports solely for earthly crowns and titles that are too soon forgotten. Rather, TKA Lions Athletics seeks added eternal and heavenly rewards that never fade.

The 2021-22 school year followed the recent trend of athletic excellence, providing a slew of victories to celebrate. As teams completed back-to-normal seasons, it became clear that this year would be one to remember. TKA Lions varsity teams:

- Compiled an impressive **72.1 % winning percentage**
- Finished **5th in Florida in the FHSAA Sunshine Cup All-Sports Awards** among 80 3A schools
- Earned **11 FHSAA postseason championships**.
- **Added beach and boys volleyball**, with **boys wrestling** slated for the 2022-23 campaign
- **Celebrated boys and girls swimming, girls basketball**, and **cheerleading's Final Four status** in the FHSAA state finals

- Recognized **Josh Zuchowski's amazing career**, whose **8 state titles** cemented him as the most decorated athlete in school history

The return of Smith Family Conservatory patrons after two seasons of COVID restrictions was a welcome change from online premieres, although the 2021-22 season presented challenges to overcome. To rebuild Conservatory momentum, **The King's Academy welcomed Mr. Kyle Schnack to lead its world-renowned performing arts program and promoted Mr. Austin Parenti to guide its rapidly growing digital media arts program.** Thankfully, King's fine arts faculty and students were up to the task, presenting fan favorites *Mary Poppins*, *The Fountain of Youth* feature film, the first installment of *Star Wars: Gray Trials* fan film, Christmas at King's, Jazz and Dessert, *Romeo + Juliet*, the TKA Film Festival, *Amelie*, *Matilda Jr.*, *The Sceptre* yearbooks, and artistic showcases galore. Dance, digital, instrumental, media, theater, visual, and vocal arts students wowed in-person crowds and online audiences with their God-given gifts and talents. Page Center audiences repaid King's young artists with standing ovations and rave reviews while online patrons pushed the TKALionheart Channel to greater heights with more than **100,000 YouTube subscribers**, earning King's a first-ever K-12 silver play button, and more than **75 million views**.

Mr. Schnack's leadership and acting acumen paid immediate dividends as Smith Family Conservatory students received 10 nominations at the Kravis Center's Dream Awards including winners:

Smith, to the Society for the Preservation of the Great American Songbook's vocal finals in Chicago. Instrumental, dance, and visual arts students also received impressive state and local awards and recognition.

Mr. Parenti's leadership of the digital media arts program has elevated The King's Academy among the nation's best in just a few years. In December 2021, Studio 70 unveiled its **first feature film *The Fountain of Youth***, premiering on the big screen at the Square's AMC Theatres while garnering national acclaim with three film festival awards to date, including a coveted Telly. The Studio also produced a number of student-produced short films including the first installment of ***Star Wars: Gray Trials*** fan film. Studio 70's climb to the top will be further enhanced by generous donors' provision of a **new digital video wall in 2022** and a soon-to-be-delivered **2,100 square foot production space, editing lab, and recording studios** on the second floor of the Esther B. O'Keeffe Innovation Center, coming in 2023.

Led by God's protection and blessing, the King's Academy's commitment to innovation and live artistic performances ensures its arts-focused students are well-prepared for future success. Smith Family Conservatory students continue to make tremendous strides, gaining momentum while other young artists are losing out on the due to benefits of in-person arts instruction. With the 2022-23 season's promise of blockbuster events including *The Little Mermaid*, *Star Wars: Gray Trials* chapters 2 and 3, *The Wreck of Echo 10-4* feature premiere, *The Nutcracker* ballet, Sight and Sound's *Ruth: The Musical*, TKA Symphony Orchestra's *Night at the Movies*, *The Music Man*, *Night of Jazz*, the **TKA Film Festival**, and *Annie Jr.*, The King's Academy's artistic momentum is growing, and its future is bright!

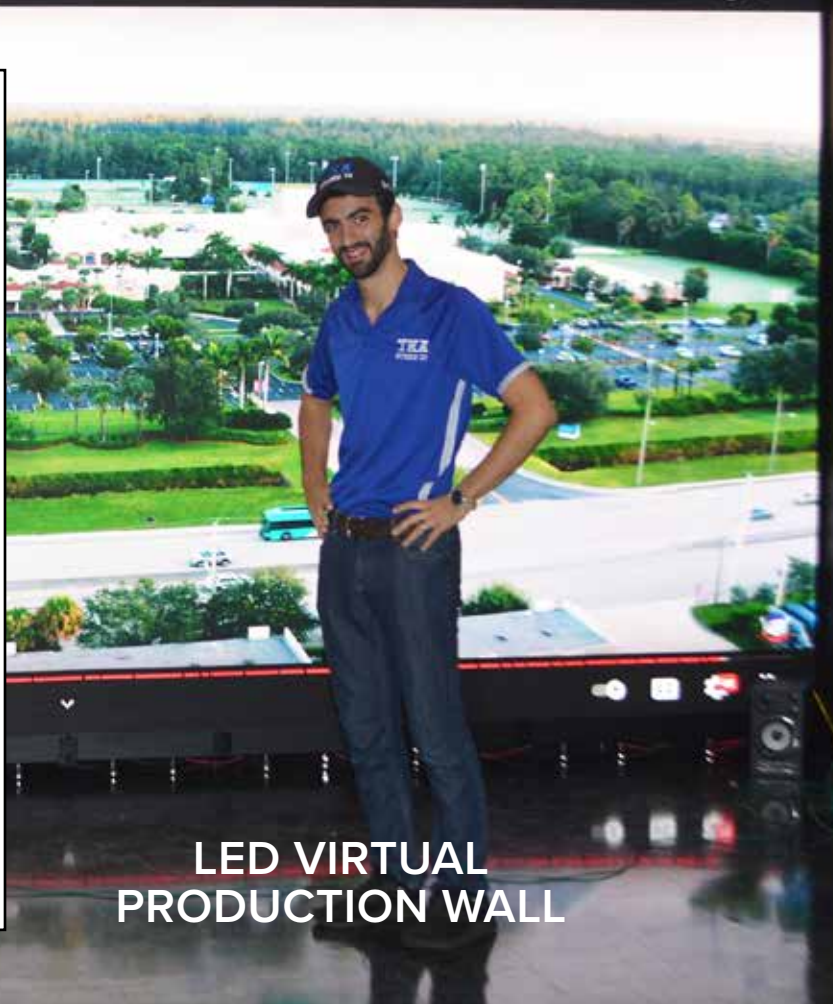

Student Body

The King's Academy seeks a diverse student body representative of its surrounding communities. It admits students of any race, color, nationality, and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded to or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national, or ethnic origin in administration of its policies, admission policies, scholarship, and loan programs.

GENDER

Male students comprised 48% and 48% of TKA students and female students were 52% and 52% of the student body during the 2021-2022 and 2020-2021 school years, respectively.

ETHNICITY

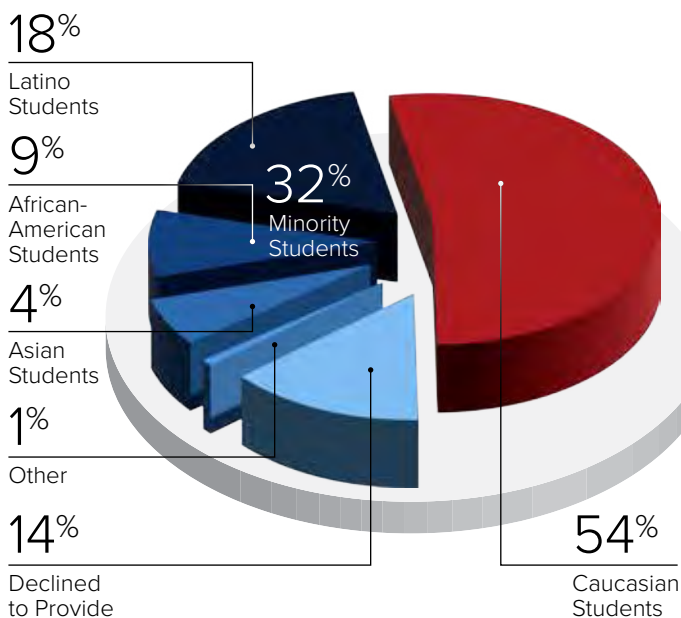
The school enrolled 54% and 56% caucasian students and 32% and 35% minority students during the 2021-2022 and 2020-2021 school years, respectively.

Hispanic and Latino students represented 18% and 19% during the two school years, African-American students comprised 9% in 2021-2022 and 9% in the year prior. Asian students comprised 4% and 5% and others' ethnicities represented 1% and 2% during the 2021-2022 and 2020-2021 school years. Approximately 14% of students declined to provide information regarding their ethnicity in 2021-2022.

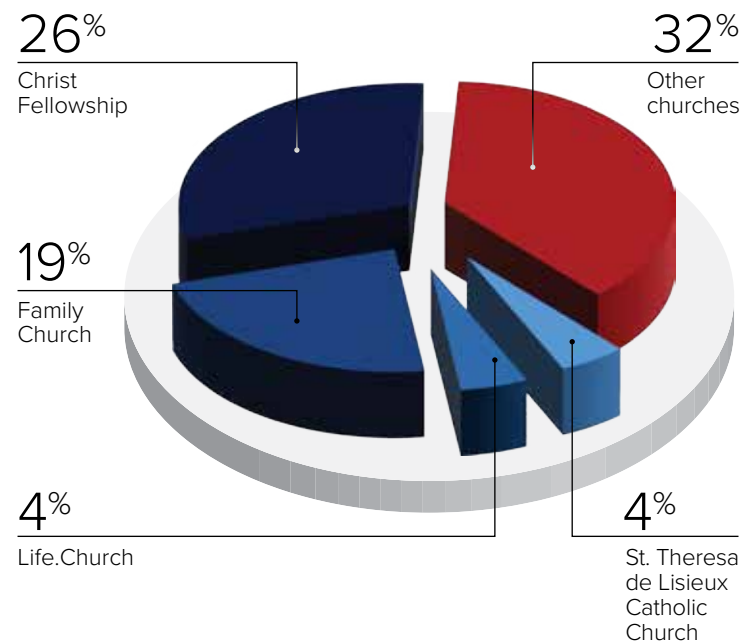
CHURCH ATTENDANCE

King's does not require its families or students to attend church or profess faith in Jesus Christ. We are thankful that many of the school's students have accepted His free gift of salvation and regularly attend church. During the 2021-2022 school year, the most frequently attended churches were Christ Fellowship (26%), Family Church (19%), Life.Church (4%), and St. Theresa de Lisieux Catholic Church (4%). Thirty-two percent of students attended more than 80 additional churches with less than 3% of the school's student body represented.

TKA IN BRIEF 2021-2022

International Students

In 2021-2022, King's International Program welcomed 88 international students from 23 countries. Since 2012, TKA has served International students from 40 different home countries on six continents. Incoming students must meet rigorous English-proficiency standards. TKA provides English as a Second Language (ESL) and specialized Bible support services for these students.

College Advising - Class of 2021

In 2022, The King's Academy graduated a senior class of 144 students. Cristina Lahud, class valedictorian, graduated with a GPA of 4.70 and salutatorian Joshua Zuchowski graduated with a 4.63 GPA. Forty-seven percent of the Class of 2022 had a 4.0 GPA or higher and 75% had a GPA that was 3.5 or higher.

COLLEGE ACCEPTANCES

The Class of 2022 had a 100% college acceptance rate with 94% attending a four-year institution. Fifty-one percent of the class received acceptances to the top 50 ranked Best National Universities or top 50 ranked National Liberal Arts Colleges. Twenty-eight percent of

the class enrolled in a Christian college or university, 35% enrolled in out-of-state colleges and universities, and 60% enrolled in Florida colleges and universities.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The King's Academy Class of 2022 earned \$10.5 million in scholarship offers, an average of more than \$73,000 per graduate. Florida Bright Futures Scholarships were awarded to 36% of the class. Twenty seniors committed to play collegiate athletics in baseball, basketball, beach volleyball, cheerleading, cross country, football, lacrosse, swimming, soccer, softball, tennis, track, and volleyball.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

The class recorded 25,002 hours of community service, an average of 174 hours per senior during their four years of high school. This contribution was worth more than \$275,000 to the citizens of Palm Beach County.

Rosemary Beaumont Library

The Rosemary Beaumont Library was utilized for instruction, classes, and events more than 1,400 times in 2021-2022. With a circulation of more 7,400 books, the

library houses 16,000 hard copies. Students also had access to more than 12 million journal articles, books, images and primary sources in 75 disciplines. The library maintains an extensive collection of thousands of original documents, many unavailable in any other collection, as well as, access to six collegiate level online data bases (including Medline and Nexis Uni) and Britannica School for Pre-K-12th grade. Key acquisitions in 2021-2022 include hundreds of thousands of volumes, magazines, newspaper, and articles, videos and images for students. The addition of iPads, manipulatives, STEM activities, and more made an incredible cooperative learning environment for all our students. Through the use of technology, students learned coding, how to access research databases, created their own books, made their own podcasts, and much more. During the 2021-2022 school year, TKA hosted author Mercedes Alfred to share her book *I Can Be* with elementary students.

Technology

The King's Academy IT Department 2021-2022 Initiatives:

- Fully deployed a new LMS, Canvas, in the MS/HS
- Launched laptop technology in the sixth grade
- Provided extensive educational technology in the new Frank DiMino Student Union including 6 Samsung Interactive whiteboards, 4 digital signage displays in the Smith Family Bistro, Pre-Med Lab technology (portable ultrasound device, digital microscopes, digital stethoscopes, digital interactive anatomy table), 4 Pre-Med Lab stations, and sound system for courtroom
- Added security cameras
- Distributed 8 laptop carts
- Provided laptops to new faculty
- Upgraded Loveland Athletic Center including removal of the old line arrays, installation of speakers and amps for chapels, addition of amps and speaker cabling into existing racks, installation

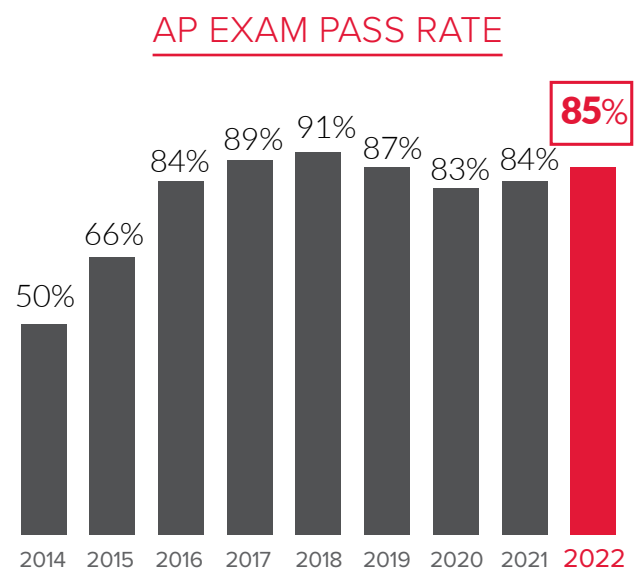

- Deployed ten 3D printers for MS/HS STEM

- Added Lexis Nexis for the O'Keeffe Pre-Law Studies program

Academic Testing

The King's Academy uses the IOWA Assessment to compare elementary and middle school students' (through grade 8) acumen to state and national standards. TKA's annual achievement testing has placed the school in the top 15% of the schools nationally. The exceptional work of students and teachers propelled TKA's results past schools that experienced noticeable declines during the pandemic.

Many of King's high school students take Advanced Placement tests in 23 courses that carry the AP designation as authorized by the College Board. **In 2022, the school had an aggregate passing rate of 85% with 349 exams taken.**

School Store (The Pride)

The King's Academy school store is open each school day from 8:00 am to 3:45 pm and throughout the summer by appointment only for uniform fittings. Conveniently located adjacent to King's main lobby, The Pride carries TKA uniforms, King's-branded apparel, gift items, school supplies, and spirit items. The store carries name brands including Champion, Under Armour, League, Tervis Tumbler and more.

Transportation

The King's Academy's 37 bus drivers and fleet of 40 buses provide transportation for approximately 700 students each day. With 30 bus routes, TKA's free transportation covers most of Palm Beach County; from Tequesta to Delray Beach and from Palm Beach to the western communities.

Clinic

TKA offers RN-provided medical support and loving care for students and faculty, including:

- Student injury report management

- Assessment of minor complaints including fever, colds, sore throats, and stomach aches
- First Aid training classes for faculty and staff
- Childhood diabetes management
- Scoliosis screenings
- Epi-Pen training for faculty and staff
- Administering prescription medication
- Maintaining immunization student medical records

Smith Family Café

During the 2021-2022 school year, the TKA Café was renamed the Smith Family Café in a special ceremony in recognition of a transformative gift from Ms. Jan Smith. The dining space was rebranded with the Smith Family Café logo on interior and exterior signage, uniforms, and equipment. The Smith Family Café is a place where students enjoy delicious meals, recharge before returning to the classroom, and build community.

Chef Keith Simone and his staff worked diligently as they served an average of nearly 1,600 meals per day. Additionally, Sage Dining catered nearly 50 events and took over game day concessions this school year.



Sage Dining is committed to excellence and works diligently to constantly improve the TKA student dining experience. They offer an exciting array of meal choices and culinary innovation to meet the diversity in Pre-K through 12th grade students' appetites and nutritional needs. Chef Simone works hand-in-hand with school administrators and staff to develop creative and appealing menus which contain delicious and healthy food choices. During the 2021-2022 school year, the Smith Family Café utilized a custom BBQ smoker, offered a special Smith Family Café dessert of the quarter, and introduced international cuisine from Argentina, Cuba, and Asia.

Maintenance

The King's Academy services its 60-acre campus in West Palm Beach with more than five acres (281,000+ square feet) of building space and three TKA preschools. King's maintenance staff is graced by an air conditioning technician, a finish carpenter, and an electrical and phone technician.

Financial Assistance

TKA awarded 149 students and disbursed \$986,000 in need-based financial assistance, enabling 120 families with financial need to send their children to King's.

Marketing

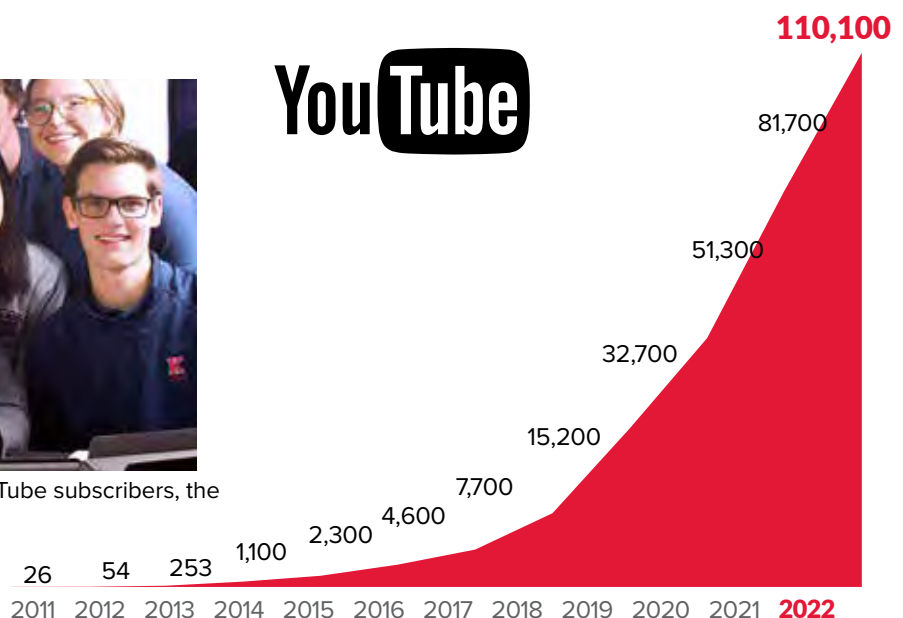
TKA's marketing plan:

Parent-Teacher Fellowship

The King's Academy invites all parents to be actively involved and volunteer through Parent Teacher Fellowship (PTF). This group comes together to encourage and celebrate faculty and staff, assist with classroom activities, parties and events, welcome new families and support the ministry of The King's Academy. Beginning in September, PTF meets the second Tuesday of each month in the Rosemary Beaumont Library to hear updates from administrators, discuss upcoming volunteer opportunities and connect with other King's families.

During the 2021-22 school year, PTF volunteered to serve at various school events including New Families Night, Open House, Grandparent's Day, Fall Book Fair, College Fair, Operation Christmas Child and faculty holiday luncheons. They also encouraged and celebrated TKA's faculty and staff throughout the year with special birthday wishes, Thanks-for-Giving breakfast, Christmas poinsettia breakfast, Spring fruit and yogurt bar, and an amazing champion themed Teacher Appreciation Week.

Many of our PTF members fostered parent-to-parent support and assisted with classroom activities and parties through TKA's elementary room parent program. Others welcomed new parents through personal notes and phone calls over the summer. PTF is a wonderful group of parents who promote school spirit, build a sense of school community, and pray daily for our administrators, teachers and staff. We are blessed to have such loving and supportive parents here at The King's Academy.

Preschool

The King's Academy Preschool (TKAP) offers excellence in Christian early education and loving care for children ages two through four at convenient locations in Greenacres, Loxahatchee/Wellington, and Palm Beach Gardens. Twice named the "Best in the West" preschool, TKAP is licensed by the Florida Department of Health of Palm Beach County. In 2022-2023, parents enrolled more than 161 students in TKA preschools.



Alumni Relations

The King's Academy continues to maintain relationships with alumni through social media outlets like Facebook and Instagram and through *The Chronicle's* Grapevine section. An alumni database of approximately 3,400 TKA graduates is managed and updated. More than 200 alumni were excited to return to campus for Homecoming 2021. During Homecoming, three alumni athletes – Richie Leber '96, Ian Williams '10, and Brooke Garmon Sheneman '10 - were inducted into the Athletic

Hall of Fame and the 2010 Competitive Cheer Team was honored to mark the 10th anniversary of their first State Championship title (beating 56 other teams of all classifications to solidify their place in history). The classes of 2010 and 2012 celebrated their 10-year reunions. Two editions of *The Chronicle* featured TKA graduates Alex (Florindo) Adams '07 and Natalie Williams '04. TKA currently has 29 alumni who have returned to work at TKA as a faculty or staff member.

Presenting The King's Academy to prospective new students, TKA's admissions staff welcomed:

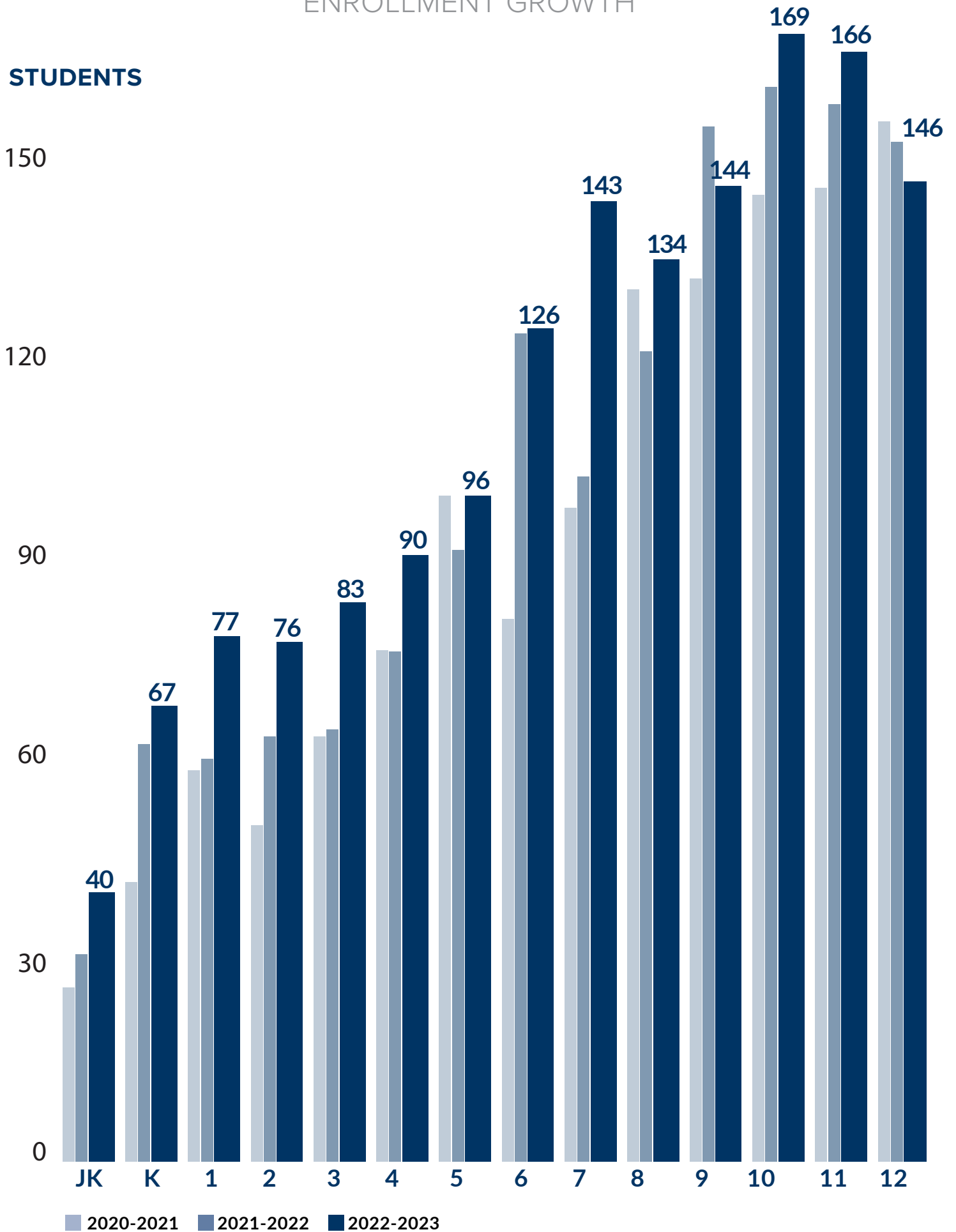
- 652 online inquiries
