Pursuant to notice posted at the Board Offices, given to each Board member, two local newspapers, and the Borough Clerk as required by Chapter 231, Public Law 1975, the Board of Education of the Borough of Sayreville held a Special Meeting on March 7, 2022.

#### DISCUSSION - TRANSPORTATION COMPLEX

Dr. Labbe, Board Members, Council Members responded to public comments.

Members of the Council shared that the Jernee Mill Road location would be the best option at this time.

Dr. Labbe suggested the Board could exchange the location of the Selover fields with the Borough for the preferred location on Cheesequake Road. The Board could develop the property while taking into consideration that the Borough may build on it in the future as well.

Mr. Frankel offered his thoughts on the areas on Cheesequake Road and inquired if another area on Cheesequake Road would work if there wasn't the cost hinderance of removing trees. Dr. Labbe shared that it would not be as favorable as the first choice on Cheesequake Road but would be more favorable than Jernee Mill Road.

The Council offered to help with the costs associated to clear a location on Cheesequake Road to make it a more desirable location for the Board, which would benefit all parties and the

Selover fields would be given to the Borough in exchange.
