There were no public comments.

BOARD DISCUSSION

Finance and /Infrastructure Committee Comments – Mr. Fernandez advised that the committee toured the Cheesequake School, reviewed completed projects and discussed potential changes to the Solar/PPA. He further explained that one of the trucks from the Facilities Department is no longer suitable for salting but will be repurposed for another use. Mrs. Bloom inquired about the press box stairs. Dr. Labbe advised that a possible solution has been forwarded to Mr. Kolmansperger for review.

Student Achievement Committee Comments – Mrs. Bloom advised the committee met and discussed the following topics: revisions to the 2021-2022 school calendar, the summer programs including Camp XL and credit recovery, the criteria for students to receive a varsity letter for Theater, revised curriculums, grading regulation revisions, and distribution of Chromebooks to students in grades 6 and 7.

12. The Board of Education of Sayreville approved the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 for submission as follows:

WHEREAS, during the public hearing held on April 26, 2022, the Board of Education discussed the 2022-2023 School District Budget and provided opportunity for public comment and at each Board meeting where the Board discussed the 2022-2023 Budget from December 21, 2021 through March 15, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the 2022-2023 School District Budget requires the use of Maintenance Reserve Funds for facility maintenance improvements in the amount of \$441,500.00; and

WHEREAS, the 2022-2023 School District Budget requires the use of Emergency Reserve Funds for security improvements in the amount of \$193,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the school district policy (Expenses - #9250) and N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3 provides that the Board of Education shall establish in the annual school budget a maximum expenditure for the 2022-2023 school year; and

WHEREAS, that the Sayreville Board of Education hereby establishes the school district travel maximum for the 2022-2023 school year at the sum of \$40,300.00 and be it further resolved that the School Business Administrator shall track and record these costs to ensure that the maximum is not exceeded. Current 2021-2022 school-year expenditures are \$6,525.92 and the budget is \$45,300.00; and

WHEREAS, the 2022-2023 Budget Comparison with Justification Reports include the supporting documentation for this 2022-2023 Budget and contains an itemization of certain expenditures and revenues required under administrative regulations; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sayreville Board of Education adopt the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 for the School District General Fund Budget of \$106,988,402.00, including a local tax levy \$67,021,492.00; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sayreville Board of Education adopt a Proposed Budget for fiscal school year 2022-2023 for the school district special revenue fund budget of \$12,409,240.00; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sayreville Board of Education adopt a Proposed Budget for fiscal school year 2022-2023 for the school district debt service fund budget of \$3,625,560.00, including a local tax levy \$3,545,909.00.

13. The Board of Education of Sayreville approved the submission of the American Rescue Plan Elementary and Secondary Schools Emergency Relief Fund - Homeless Children and Youths (ARP-HCY II) grant application in the amount of \$26,813.00.

14. The Board of Education of Sayreville approved the submission of the FY23 Perkins Secondary Consolidated Grant application to support career and technical education.

15. The Board of Education of Sayreville approved a lease agreement between 132 Main Street LLC and the Sayreville Board of Education for the period May 1, 2022 through June 30, 2022 for 132 Main Street, Unit 2 in an amount of \$6,475.00 (\$2,775 security deposit and \$1,850 monthly rent).

16. The Board of Education of Sayreville approved a lease agreement between 132 Main Street LLC and the Sayreville Board of Education for the period of July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2027 for 132 Main Street, Unit 2 in an amount of \$22,200 in the first year (\$1,850 monthly rent). Rent will be subject to a three percent (3%) annual increase beginning in the second year of the lease.

Pricing has been obtained through the ESCNJ bid award for Carpet and Flooring, Bid #ESCNJ 19/20-05. To be paid utilizing PEA funding.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AGREEMENT FOR CERTAIN LEGAL SERVICES ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BOROUGH OF SAYREVILLE IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX

WHEREAS, there exists a need for specialized legal services in connection with the preparation for a bond referendum and the authorization and the issuance of obligations of The Board of Education of The Borough of Sayreville in the County of Middlesex, (the “Board”), a body corporate of the State of New Jersey, including the review of such procedures and the rendering of approving legal opinions acceptable to the financial community; and

WHEREAS, such special legal services can be provided only by a recognized Bond Counsel firm, and the law firm of McManimon, Scotland & Baumann, LLC, Roseland, New Jersey is so recognized by the financial community; and

WHEREAS, the fee will be \$5,000.00 plus \$1.00 per thousand dollars up to the first \$15,000,000; \$.75 per thousand dollars of any bonds in excess of \$15,000,000 up to \$30,000,000; and \$.50 per thousand dollars of any bonds issued in excess of \$30,000,000 of securities issued and funds will be available for this purpose through the funding of the referendum;

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BOROUGH
OF SAYREVILLE IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, AS FOLLOWS:**

The law firm of McManimon, Scotland & Baumann, LLC, Roseland, New Jersey is hereby retained to provide specialized legal services necessary in connection with the referendum and the authorization and the issuance of obligations of the Board in accordance with an Agreement dated as of April 26, 2022 and submitted to the Board (the "Contract"). The Contract is awarded without competitive bidding as a "Professional Service" in accordance with the Public School Contracts Law, N.J.S.A.18A:18A-5(a)(1), because it is for services performed by persons authorized by law to practice a recognized profession. A copy of this resolution as well as the Contract shall be placed on file with the Secretary of the Board. A notice in accordance with the Public School Contracts Law of New Jersey in the form attached hereto shall be published in the Home News Tribune.

WHEREAS, the BOE own certain property, commonly known as Block 498, Lot 1, Block 499 Lot 1, and Block 502 Lot 1 in the Borough of Sayreville (the “BOE Property”); and

WHEREAS, the BOE Property contains three (3) athletic fields, a playground and an associated parking area; and

WHEREAS, the Borough owns certain property, commonly known as Block 28.01, Lot 1.03 in the Borough of Sayreville (the “Borough Property”); and

WHEREAS, the BOE is in need of a new bus staging and service area (the “School Transportation Facility”) and the Borough is in need of athletic fields, playground and a parking area for its recreational programs; and

WHEREAS, The BOE is willing to lease the BOE Property (not including the teacher parking lots and Selover School, including front lawn) to the Borough and the Borough is willing to lease an approximately 7+/- acre portion of the Borough Property to the BOE; and

WHEREAS, the BOE and Borough wish for this MOU to memorialize their intentions with regard to the aforementioned property leasing while the remaining details and documents for same are negotiated by the BOE and Borough and approval is obtained by their respective Governing Bodies and the New Jersey Department of Education, as applicable; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the parties to this Memorandum of Understanding agree as follows, subject to the negotiation, approval and execution of written leases for the BOE and Borough properties and subject to New Jersey Department of Education approval; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the BOE will lease a portion of the BOE Property to the Borough for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00); and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough will lease a portion of the Borough Property to the BOE for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00); and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the exact areas to be leased will be shown on surveys attached to the applicable lease; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the term of the leases shall be for 50 years with a 25-year renewal option to the extent then permitted by law; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough will clear the trees and remove stumps from the Borough Property as may be necessary for the BOE to construct the School Transportation Facility, not to exceed 5 acres of trees / stumps; and will waive all tree replacement requirements and/or fees/fines associated with the tree and stump removal; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that when constructing the School Transportation Facility, the BOE will construct the access road through to the end of the leased portion of the Borough; and
