## Summer Learning and Fun!

he district was excited to offer enrichment programs for a variety of subject areas and grade levels this past summer. Many programs returned from years priors and others were brand new. The Brentwood Learn to Swim Program, which was first offered in the summer of 2021 for elementary students only, hosted its first Junior Lifeguarding class. The students in this class learned what it takes to become a great lifeguard.

The Elementary Summer Scholars and Science Enrichment Programs were designed to build our students' literacy, math, and problem-solving skills as well as their socialemotional competencies. In addition to providing our children with crucial access to books and science experiments, the summer program focused on creating safe circles for children to read, learn, engage in critical thinking and discuss the human

experience. Literature, particularly multi-cultural literature, provided



ural literature, provided both self-affirmation and a way to learn about and appreciate various cultures, dialects, and ways of being in the world. The 7 Strengths such as belonging, curiosity, friendship, kindness, confidence, courage, and hope were nurtured during morning read aloud to give students a positive sense of self.



This year a program for students entering grade 1 also engaged our youngest learners in activities to develop their phonemic awareness, number sense, and social skills. Outdoor play and puppet shows were also brought into the school day to entertain students and engage them in physical activity.

Once again, our Title III Summer Programs were a tremendous success. Elementary and secondary students got to experience, explore, and enjoy new and creative ways of learning. From puppet theater performances to STEM building SPIKE Lego coding robots, students had the opportunity to shine! They presented projects they cared about and some even got to enter their own courtroom and try a case fulfilling each and every role. Social Emotional Learning Connections were infused in each and every activity and learning experience, and they also learned about internet safety with the renowned presenter, Tim Shoemaker. Most importantly they got to learn new things, form new friendships, and to just HAVE FUN!

Carol Ann Grodski, the District's School Lunch Manager, is excited to launch this initiative. "It's a great opportunity to expose children to more food choices. I am happy to increase the variety of foods we serve." she said.

The District's food service staff underwent training to learn best practices when preparing Halal meals, which included how to avoid cross contamination. In addition,



special colored utensils have been ordered for the kitchens to separate those used for Halal and non Halal foods.

With the initiative well underway, we are happy to say it is going well. Feedback from students has been positive. "We have been tasting the new Halal menu many times and the food is actually really amazing", said Minnahil Tariq at a recent Board of Education meeting. She went on to say, "I am really thankful for there to be new options not only for me, but for students in the District".
