Abbey ran a brilliant assembly followed by some drama workshops. On Tuesday, Years 4, 5 and 6, had a visit from Karen and Vasily from Richmond MIND. There were useful discussions across the year groups about what constitutes bullying, who bullies and what consequences there can be for people who are bullied. Karen and Vasily were really impressed with the knowledge and enthusiasm of the boys and the maturity they showed when discussing some challenging topics.

On Thursday, our Safer Schools Officer from the Metropolitan police, known to us all as P.C. Mick, ran a workshop for Years 7 and 8. The theme for discussion was appropriate social

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media use. Discussions were wide ranging and questions numerous. P.C. Mick was impressed with how well informed our boys were and with the empathy and enthusiasm shown. We also had the opportunity to go into the new hall and try out the new, very comfy, banked seating. Swimming Successes

George Gill, Hugo Hogarth and Rory Wouters form a core of excellent swimmers in Year 7 and they regularly train and compete outside school. Hugo swims for Wandsworth Swimming Club and Rory and George swim for Barnes Swimming Club. Both clubs have held their club championships over the last few weekends.

Here is how they did:

Hugo was awarded the gold medal in the 400m freestyle and the 800m freestyle. The silver in the 50m breaststroke, 100m breaststroke and 200m breaststroke and bronze in the 50m fly and 200m freestyle.

George was awarded gold in the 200m, 400m and 800m freestyle; silver in the 50m freestyle and 100m breaststroke; bronze in the 50m breaststroke, 100m individual medley and 50m Fly.

Rory was awarded the gold medal in 1500m freestyle (the youngest competitor in the 60-length event!), gold in the 800m freestyle, silver in the 100m individual medley and 200m freestyle; bronze in the 50m backstroke, 50m fly and 50m freestyle.

Eagled eyed viewers will wonder how George and Rory seem to have shared some medals - this is because they compete in different age groups because of when their birthdays fall.

These successes are just reward for many hours of dedicated training and our congratulations go out to our amazing Year 7 swimmers!
