
From the Principal...


Statistics in the World

Students applied concepts they had been studying. Students then made a display of their findings as seen in the images. All students were asked to reflect on their processes and, when asked "what the


Student Council Homecoming Dance

ASD 17-FOOD SERVICE NEWS Free Meals Ending

FREE MEALS-ENDING

The money the district had received from the state through the SMART fund grant will be consumed on December 31, 2022. These funds had allowed us to offer free meals through December. RSD 17 will begin charging households that are eligible for reduced –priced and full paid meals on January 3, 2023.

Meal pricing for the 2022-2023 school year: Elementary Schools- Breakfast-\$2.50, Lunch \$3.25, Reduced Breakfast-\$0.30, Reduced Lunch- \$0.40 HKIMS - Breakfast-\$2.50, Lunch \$3.50, Reduced Breakfast-\$0.30, Reduced Lunch-\$0.40 High School- Lunch \$3.50, Reduced Lunch- \$0.40

FREE/REDUCED MEALS FOR QUALIFYING FAMILIES FOR THE ENTIRE YEAR-Those who qualify and who have registered will receive free and reduced meals for the rest of the school year. Households that may qualify for free or reduced meals should submit a free and reduced application as soon as possible to determine a student's eligibility for the remainder of the school year. Households that do not submit an application or whose child is not directly certified will automatically default to full pay on January 3, 2023.

Applications are available at each school and online. Once completed, applications should be returned to your child's school secretary.

There will be an introduction to post-secondary planning, and a discussion on Naviance, including the eDocs program that all seniors will use next year when requesting teacher recommendations, having transcripts sent to colleges, etc. Juniors will also meet with their School Counselors in groups during Advisory prior to Junior Planning Night. Counselors will be meeting with Juniors and their families individually in the coming months.
