



Kindergarten Entry Goals

Children are natural learners. Their innate curiosity, sense of wonder and exploratory nature are traits that will be fostered and nourished in Prior Lake-Savage Area Schools' kindergarten program. Kindergarten students will experience growth in the following curricular areas: Social Readiness, Self-Help Skills, Work Habits, Reading, Writing, Science, Technology, Math, Social Studies, Health & Safety, Music, Art and Physical Education.

Some ideas to help prepare your child for kindergarten are listed below.

- **Demonstrates increasing comfort with separation from family/caregivers**
- **Manages clothing, bathroom use and outdoor gear independently**
- **Speaks their first and last name when asked**
- **Shares their parents/caregivers first and last name when asked**
- **Asks for help when needed**
- **Tries hard to complete a task of interest**
- **Enjoys reading together and is careful handling books**
- **Writes their first name**
- **Recognizes some letters and can make their sounds**
- **Asks: Who, What, When, Where, Why and How questions**
- **Labels how she or he is feeling**
- **Labels how a friend or family member is feeling**
- **Counts to 10**
- **Can identify "more" and "less"**
- **Enjoys puzzles**
- **Draws a picture and replaces the marker cap when finished**
- **Labels 5 shapes**
- **Moves safely from one place to the next, quickly and slowly**
- **Hold a scissors and pencil**

Practice at Home

You can support your child at home by:

- Reading together
- Counting items in the grocery cart
- Talking about feelings and singing songs
- Encouraging independence in the bathroom and with dressing
- Playing together imaginatively
- Writing your names together - then talk about the letter names and their sounds
- Practicing your home address and phone number
