**Superintendent's Report**

Superintendent Cordon shared input from the all-staff survey regarding the district professional learning model. He reported the key takeaways from staff:

- Staff care deeply about student learning and well-being;
- Staff want to help create a system that allows students to succeed inside and outside the classroom;
- Most respondents agree that more time to implement and collaborate on current professional learning is needed, although they also want more time for prep and planning,

Resulting common themes:

- ◆ More collaboration time
- ◆ More choice
- ◆ More time to implement
- ◆ More prep and planning time
- ◆ More differentiation

**Student Success Act—Student Investment Account (SIA) 2021-22 Annual Report**

Asst. Supt. Michelle Knee, presented the 2021-22 Final Report for this grant that targets support for student mental and behavioral health; increasing academic achievement; reducing academic disparities for students from racial or ethnic groups that historically experienced academic disparities; students with disabilities; English Language Learners; economically disadvantaged students; students who are homeless and students who are foster children. Michelle revisited the four strategies utilized in our district, including investments in Class Size, Well-Rounded Education, Instructional Time, and Health and Safety. The final 2021-2022 SIA grant totaled \$4,284,185.91.

The Board voted to submit a vote in support of Jacqueline Crook for LPC position 9, representing the South Coast and Douglas County region.
