ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

A. Watson Armour III Educational Fund **\$1,298,655**

An endowed fund to provide income in support of new educational programs, courses, or activities.

Mark and Jane Barlow Endowment **\$1,078,236**

Established to honor Mark and Jane Barlow, this fund provides income for moral and ethical education at St. Mark's.

St. Mark's Biology Prize **\$6,897**

To support the Avis-Plisz Biology Prize.

Breck Art Fund **\$1,274,797**

Principal created by the sale of artwork, the income is to be used for the restoration and security of the School's artwork.

Cabot Fund **\$50,812**

Income for works of art – principal and interest used at the discretion of Trustees to buy and install antique or modern architectural ornamental detail in the School building or grounds.

Carey Art Endowment **\$32,936**

Established in honor of former faculty member Eve Carey, the income is to be used to support materials for ceramics as well as visits by guest lecturers.

The Jay G. Engel Cultural Fund was established in 2002 to honor Jay Engel on the occasion of his retirement from St. Mark's School. In 2017, this fund was renamed in honor of Barbara Putnam for her dedication to continuing and expanding enhanced cultural opportunities for students.
