Learn More: Change of Learning Environment Process

Tomball ISD families now have the opportunity to make a change to your child(ren)'s current learning environment (F2F/TVS) for the second grading period, which begins the week of October 26 and runs through the end of the fall semester.

This process is now open as of Oct. 2 and will remain open through Oct. 11. During that 10 day window, families will log in to <u>Home Access Center (HAC)</u> to make any necessary changes.

Please note: This process only applies to those families that want to make a change to their current instructional environment either in person (face-to-face) or virtual. If families want their child to continue in the environment they attended for the first grading period, you will not need to take further action.

If families choose to make a change, they must make the change **for each child** through the <u>Home Access Center</u>.

Schoology (pronounced: *Skool'uh-jee*) is our first ever learning management system in Tomball ISD which offers a platform for organization, collaboration, communication, discussion boards, multimedia lessons, as well as a place to submit assignments and allows for easy teacher feedback/grading. Schoology has a simplified navigation and a similar layout to social media. It is also iPad compatible and fully integrates with *Google Apps for Education*.

Students have been provided instructions on how to gain access to their Courses by logging into ClassLink.

Tomball ISD Receives High Financial Ratings from S&P and Moody's



TOMBALL - For its continued focus on financial stability and its robust financial position, Tomball ISD has once again earned high financial ratings of AA+ by S&P and Aa1 by Moody's, announced by the rating agencies on Tuesday, Sept. 29. Standard & Poor (S&P) Global Ratings and Moody's Investor Services provided ratings that are important prior to the sale of bonds on the open market. Both rating agencies use rating rationale for a credit overview that focuses on the local economy, finances of the district driven by property values, average daily attendance, a financial management assessment, and a review of the overall net debt of the district.

S&P affirmed Tomball ISD's 'AA+' underlying rating with an outlook on all ratings of stable. Moody's affirmed the 'Aa1' rating with a stable outlook.

"It is extremely important for Tomball ISD to maintain these high financial ratings because our District is growing rapidly and the need to sell bonds is ongoing," TISD Chief Financial Officer Jim Ross said. "These high ratings result in interest expense savings which is millions saved over the life of bonds sold."

Tomball ISD joins a short list of Texas school districts to earn such high ratings by both services. In the State of Texas, there are 1,246 public and charter schools that can sell bonds and are subject to financial rating reviews. Of those, only 23 districts are ranked as high as Tomball ISD with S&P and only 16 districts are ranked as high as Tomball ISD with Moody's.

It was indicated in the reports that "high reserves and liquidity provide a cushion to weather any unforeseen financial obstacles, such as responding to the pandemic." It was also stated in the reports that the rating "reflects the expectation that solid financial practices will continue to govern fiscal management, allowing reserves to remain favorable."

Spotlight: Community Youth Services Specialist (CYS) Sam Promise



Now more than ever, Tomball ISD has really focused on the need to foster a culture of caring and compassionate educators that can help support the needs of its families, while still providing a high-quality learning environment.

While it is a team effort to truly build relationships and trust within the community that allows Tomball ISD to succeed in educating the whole child, it is the work done by its Community Youth Services Specialist, that really drives the intentional focus on assisting students and families in times of need.

Meet Sam Promise. She joined Tomball ISD as a contracted employee with Harris County Protective Services in November 2019, and has been a true asset to the District as its CYS Specialist since her arrival.

"As a CYS Specialist, our responsibility is to partner with school districts, government agencies, and local community resource organizations in order to assist students and their families in addressing their needs," she said.

Along with assisting families in the Tomball community, Promise also advises district staff that may discover evidence of child abuse or neglect and assists students who are experiencing a crisis at home or have no home.

"CYS workers are able to converse with families about their situations and access community services and resources during regular business hours. We have more of a flexible schedule, which allows us to be accessible to resources and supplies from organizations that in turn, can be delivered to homes or campuses," Promise said.

Promise brings eight years of school district experience to this role as she last served as a Social Services Specialist for seven years in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

When asked about why she chose this career path and what drives her to serve in this capacity, Promise was quick to mention her upbringing.

"I grew up in a household of social workers. Both of my parents worked in the social service field, assisting various populations, such as college students, elderly and families. Their work ethic molded my idea of serving the public," she said.

As a valuable link between the schools and the community, Promise serves all 21 campuses in Tomball ISD. Since her arrival, she has solidified a connection through advocacy, education and personal empowerment.

"The most rewarding part about my job is being able to assist individuals in finding resources and resolutions while helping them reach peace of mind about their situation."
