Hamilton Elementary students participated in a 'Life Cycle of Salmon' project that culminated with the release of over 150 Coho salmon fry! Students watched the salmon in a tank housed in the library, and the entire school was able to follow the experiment to make scientific observations. The salmon eggs came from the Hurd Creek hatchery on the Dungeness River. Their permit required them to plant the salmon in Valley Creek in Port Angeles. Fifth-grade students had a series of lessons provided by the North Olympic Salmon Coalition that taught students all about the life cycle of the salmon and the importance of this species. Very cool!

\$30 AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM PLANS FOR FAMILIES

Great news for families in our district! The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is offering eligible households high-speed internet (100Mbps download) for \$30 a month with no additional out-of-pocket costs.

There are 3 ways families can qualify:

- Income of 200% or less than the Federal poverty guidelines
- Program participation (such as Free Reduced Lunch Program eligible, or SNAP, etc.), or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating broadband provider's existing low-income internet program

For those that meet the eligibility requirements:

- \$30 guaranteed plan download speed of 100 Mbps
- 20 providers to choose from
- New or existing internet plans
- 3 ways to qualify
