Thank you to everyone who came out to the 13th Annual Back to School Fair! This year we had 11 informational booths hosted by community and school-based programs.


Sodexo employees and **Kiwanis members** handed out seven-day meal sets and extra lunches for a total of **5,711 meals!** Wow!

<u>Creating Connections to Support Port Angeles Youth</u>

Schools in Port Angeles are partnering with local law enforcement to help students exposed to traumatic situations by launching our own "Handle With Care" program! We created a local "Handle With Care" program to get reports when a student is exposed to a traumatic event. Port Angeles School District teachers and staff will be ready with trauma-sensitive approaches, like sending students to the counselor instead of the principal. We are starting "Handle With Care" to enable law enforcement to notify District leaders when a student was present at a traumatic event.

A collaboration of first responders, community-based organizations, and the school district supports youth in Port Angeles through Handle With Care. Partners include City of Port Angeles Fire Department, Port Angeles Police Department, The Lower Elwha Klallam Tribe Police Department, Clallam County Sheriff's Office, Port Angeles Healthy Youth Coalition, and Clallam Resilience Project (a project of the United Way). 


