The Joe Glatz "Rocket Man" Science Grant for Teachers



Joe was an elementary teacher in the PASD for 29 years. He passed away in April after living with cancer since 2019. Joe was passionate about science and developed lessons and units that generated curiosity and inquisitiveness through experiential learning and hands-on activities. He earned the "Rocket Man" title by ending every school year building and launching model rockets with his students. To this day, there are probably a few rockets on the roof of Hamilton School.



To honor Joe's memory and dedication to students and scientific learning, the Joe Glatz "Rocket Man" Science Grant fund was established. By completing a simple application through the Port Angeles Education Foundation, Port Angeles teachers may apply for a grant to fund science-based, hands-on classroom projects or experiential learning opportunities for the 2021-22 school year.
