Port Angeles Food Bank, School District, and Community Partners Team Up to Tackle Childhood Hunger

When the pandemic started last year, the **Port Angeles Food Bank (PA Food Bank)**, the **Port Angeles School District (PASD)**, and **Sodexo** came together to make sure food-insecure children who depend on school programs would still have access to nourishing meals. With help from the PA Food Bank, the District provides hundreds of bags of easy-to-prepare food every Thursday and Friday afternoon to enjoy throughout the weekend. Each week, PASD sends home more than 600-weekend food bags, and 75 children picked up Spring Break bags on Tuesday, April 6. From September 1 through March 31 PASD has served 258,755 meals; an average of 1,220 meals per day.

Weekend Food Bags include breakfast, lunch, dinner, and snack items for children. While children are on break, the PA Food Bank also provides food items in the Break Bags for children in our region. Last month's Spring Break bags contained ground beef, eggs, and fresh produce, funded in part by the **Albert Haller Foundation**. The Spring Break bags also had \$50 Safeway gift cards from the PA Food Bank. The **Safeway** grocery gift cards were made possible through community donations during **NW Harvest's** "Harvest for Hunger" Food Drive this past fall. Funds raised from this event allowed NW Harvest to provide gift cards to food banks throughout Washington. The PA Food Bank provided \$35,000 in \$50 Safeway grocery gift cards to the Port Angeles School District. KINDERGARTEN STRIDER PROGRAM FUNDED!

Next year, all kindergarteners will be able to participate in the **All Kids Bike (AKB) Program** made possible by local sponsors **Lincoln Park BMX Association** and **Sound Bikes and Kayaks!** This program includes a fleet of 24 Strider AKB-Specific Bikes, helmets, pedal conversion kits, and one Strider 20 Bike for teacher instruction, and curriculum. PEI shared this about the cards. "Our career profile cards are a teaching tool that can be used to increase student awareness of family-wage jobs in the environmental, natural resource, outdoor recreation, and renewable energy sectors. These cards offer students an idea of careers that exist in Washington State."

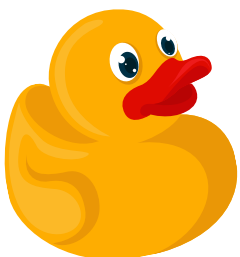
