

The All Kids Bike® (AKB) program for kindergarten and first-grade students is officially underway!

AKB is a national movement led by the Strider® Education Foundation. Hamilton Elementary first-graders tried out the Strider bikes for the first time this month! Students learned how to put on helmets correctly, and staff made sure they fit properly. After the safety talk, students spent a few minutes practicing putting the kickstand up and down, and then it was time to straddle the bikes and take them for a spin! For some students, this was their first time on a bike. The goal of this program is to teach safe riding skills and build confidence.

PE Teacher Krista Winn shared this "aha" moment: A little girl was scared of the bike and hesitant to try. I asked her to straddle the bike and stand in one place. Then I went off to watch others (but was really watching her). She started taking tiny, tiny baby steps with the encouragement of another student who stopped to help her. It was like teaching a baby to walk their first steps. I went back over to her and stood about two steps in front of her and said, "See if you can walk to me!" and she did! The next thing I knew, she was circling the gym with the other students. After class, she came up to me and asked, "I did good today, didn't !?". I told her how proud I was of her and her bravery gave me goosebumps!

This weeks' staff spotlight is Jamie Williams - Office Administrator – Sodexo Food Services




