Tentative Plans for In-Person Graduation Ceremonies

We are excited to announce our tentative plans to offer in-person graduation ceremonies for our Class of 2021 at Port Angeles High School and Lincoln High School. Under current Phase 3 guidelines, each graduate will have the opportunity to invite up to two guests to attend ceremonies in person. We also plan to offer a live stream of the PAHS graduation ceremony to ensure that all family members and friends will have the chance to participate in this occasion.

Port Angeles High School Graduation is scheduled for Friday, June 11. To provide the safest possible environment for our graduation ceremony, the current plan is to hold the event at Civic Field. Lincoln High School Graduation is scheduled for Monday, June 14. Location information to be released at a later date. All people in attendance must wear face coverings and maintain a safe physical distance. Other COVID-19 precautions will be posted as necessary.

Keep in mind, the phase status for each county is individually evaluated every three weeks. While all counties moved into Phase 3 on March 22, 2021, it is possible that Clallam County's phase could change by the time graduation comes around. Planning must adjust to any such changes to prioritize public safety.

While we are working through details, we know how important it is to get this initial information to the Class of 2021, their families, and our community. Thank you for your support, grace, and flexibility during these uncertain times. Please understand that these plans are tentative and based upon the current conditions of the pandemic. Thanks for your ongoing partnership as we near this momentous celebration!

I'm From


I am from cedar trees,

Thank you, Janice, for your kindness and compassion towards our community and students. Your drive and determination to help are greatly appreciated. We are lucky you are here!




