MARTY'S MINUTE




Port Angeles High School Grad Rates are on the Rise!

The Port Angeles School District has another reason to celebrate student success. For the seventh year in a row, graduation rates have increased at Port Angeles High School (PAHS). The Washington Office of Superintendent of **Public Instruction (OSPI) releases** graduation rates each January, and the PAHS class of 2020 had a 93.5% graduation rate among 262 students. These graduation rates have steadily climbed since 2014, and this last year they leaped

into the 90th percentile. Graduation rates for students from low-income households and students with disabilities are also on the rise. In 2020, 90.7% of students from low-income households graduated from PAHS compared to the Washington States rate of 75.1%. Last year, PAHS saw an incredible jump to 84.2% for graduation rates of students with disabilities, compared to 2019's graduation rate of 62.5%. Gains for PAHS students with disabilities continue to outpace the state's overall percentage rate of 64.5%.

Congratulations to the students, families, staff, and our community who have played had a part in achieving our highest graduation rate in recent history!









<u>Please say hello to Betsy Wharton!</u>

Betsy is a teacher up at PAHS. Before joining the PASD Team, Besty worked as a registered nurse in various settings such as hospice, home health, and community health, including international work. Betsy also worked at First Step Family Support Center in Maternity Support Services, which offers preventive health and education services to help women have a healthy pregnancy and a healthy baby. You may know Betsy outside of PASD as she is our Former Deputy Mayor for the City of Port Angeles and used to run a small business, The Clallam Canning Company, making pickles and sauerkraut. Now she cooks for fun. Yum!

Betsy started teaching career tech education and health sciences in the fall of 2019 at PAHS. She heard about the job in September and found herself in a classroom a week later. The program she teaches caters to students who are interested in medicine, dentistry, veterinary science, nursing, early childhood education and other healthrelated fields. Betsy teaches three courses: emergency response, a survey of healthcare careers, and medical terminology. She also facilitates a club called the Medical Careers Club that is working on building an on-campus offshoot of our county's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) called the Teen CERT. This program will develop a support team of resilient and competent students to help with natural disasters. Currently, students are helping out at the vaccine clinic on the weekends up at the high school. Betsy shared that this gives the kids real-life experience to interact with the public and do real-life activities. The students aren't allowed inside the gym during the vaccination clinic. Still, they donate their time by helping route cars in the parking lot, assisting people in wheelchairs, and reading consent forms for those who need help. Thank you, Betsy and students, for your time and assistance!

Betsy grew up in Delaware and now has two grown kids who went through PA schools. She has an Australian shepherd dog, a cat, and seven chickens. Betsy loves to white river kayak, garden, and anything else that gets her out in nature.

Betsy made sure to note that she is so grateful and excited to spend time with students again in person during the hybrid model. Betsy, we are lucky to have you to teach our students and keep our community safe and healthy! Thank


A note from Senior Chief Justin Beck:
