DETERMINE to be determined.

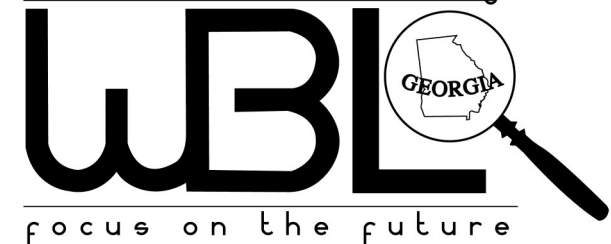
People are very rarely overnight successes. More often, character is the result of a long process of determined determination. Stay the course.

What is Good Character?
