
Elementary Students Excited for Author Visit

Tith the new year comes a new board of education! With two newly appointed members and three experienced members, the school board is looking forward to working together to honorably serve the students, staff and community.

Doug Hart with his wife, Marlene, moved to the Northridge school district in 2010. He started serving on the finance committee in 2011 and was appointed to the Northridge Board of Education in 2012.
