CURRICULUM

Kents Hill School operates on a semester system. Students are typically enrolled in 6 courses, though some students are permitted to enroll in 5 courses with permission from the Dean of Academics. Most Kents Hill students advance well beyond the basic graduation requirements.

SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

Our **4D Academic Curriculum** ensures that each student builds a strong foundation of knowledge, skills, character, and reflection.

All Kents Hill students participate in our **PEAK Program (Principles, Ethics, and Action at Kents Hill)** to explore their own values and engage with people who think and behave differently.

Our **Advisory program** is about making connections that last a lifetime. Each student is assigned a faculty advisor who is dedicated to providing support and guidance in all aspects of life at Kents Hill.

Challenging academic offerings include Advanced Placement (AP) and Dual-Enrollment college classes, and curriculum-based tutoring through the **Akin Learning Center**.

The **Postgraduate (PG) Program** provides high school graduates with opportunities to broaden their horizons, nurture their personal growth, and evaluate their personal and academic goals before college.
