Following the Counselor meetings, parents are invited to a college presentation in the auditorium. A panel of college Admission Counselors will answer questions about the college process and campus experience.


Parents of college-bound Juniors are encouraged to attend. A flyer for the event will be sent out soon!

#### **COLLEGE "FUN FACTS"!**



- Founded in 1766, Rutgers is older than the nation itself and is the eighth oldest college in the U.S.
- Rutgers' first mascot was a Chanticleer or a fighting rooster! It was changed to the Scarlet Knight in 1955 due to its similarities to a chicken.
- Rutgers University and Princeton played the first game of intercollegiate football in 1869. Rutgers won the game 6-4.
- Rutgers are famous for their "fat sandwiches". The first sandwich was the "Fat Cat" created in 1979. In 2004, Maxim Magazine named "Fat Darrell" as the nation's best sandwich.

#### **Substance Abuse Group**

This group is designed to support students faced with substance use disorder to navigate the road to recovery and repair the damage caused by addiction. This group is led by a SMART Recovery Coach. SMART Recovery is a transformative method of moving from addictive substances and negative behaviors to a life of positive self-regard and willingness to change.

#### **COLLEGE SPOTLIGHT**

The College of New Jersey (TCNJ) is a highly selective institution that is consistently recognized as one of the top comprehensive colleges in the nation. Founded in 1855 as the New Jersey State Normal School, TCNJ maintains the seventh highest four-year graduation rate among all public colleges and universities. It is ranked by Money as one of the top 15 public colleges "most likely to pay off financially," and U.S. News & World Report rates it the No. 1 public institution among regional universities in the northeast.

Known for its natural beauty, the college is situated on 289 tree-lined acres in suburban Ewing Township, New Jersey, in close proximity to both New York City and Philadelphia. A strong liberal arts core forms the foundation for a wealth of degree programs offered through the college's seven schools: Arts and Communication; Business; Education; Engineering; Humanities and Social Sciences; Nursing and Health Sciences; and Science. Five signature experiences are the hallmark of a TCNJ education. They include a personalized, collaborative, and rigorous education; undergraduate research, mentored internships, and field experiences; community engaged learning; global engagement; and leadership development.

Scholarships.com - Divides scholarships by a variety of unique categories, including GPA, military affiliation, ethnicity, artistic ability, ACT or SAT score and residing state.

**Going Merry** - Lets students type in information once and apply for multiple scholarships at the same time.

Scholarship Owl - Compiles awards and amount, organizes them by requirements, number of winners and length of time until the application is due.
