Outside agencies and schools meeting quarterly to share resources and meet Transition related needs in Price County.









#### Release forms

Individual signs a release form authorizing a specific person access to certain information or records.



Supported Decision-Making Agreement

Individual makes all their own decisions. They identify a supporter/s to assist them.



Representative Payee

Social Security
Administration
appoints an
individual/org.
to receive
SSI/SSDI
benefits for an
individual who
cannot manage
their own.



Power of Attorney, (medical or financial)

Formal legal arrangements that permit others to act on the individual's behalf.




Limited or Full Guardianship

Transfers some or all decisionmaking authority from the individual to a courtappointed Guardian.




