**ADDENDUM TO EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT BETWEEN
SHAWN LENNEY AND THE GOVERNING BOARD OF
THE GREATER OHIO VIRTUAL SCHOOL**

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the Greater Ohio Virtual School (the "Board") and Shawn Lenney (the "Executive Director") are parties to a contract effective from August 1, 2021 through July 31, 2026 (the "Contract") employing Executive Director as Executive Director of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Board and the Executive Director desire to amend the Contract as set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AGREED by and between the Board and the Executive Director as follows:

1. A new Section 5(M) shall be added to the Contract that reads as follows:
 - M. Effective August 1, 2022 through July 31, 2023, Executive Director shall serve as the teacher of record for the music classes offered by the Board provided that he continues to maintain all necessary licenses to serve in such role as required by the State of Ohio. Such duties shall be served outside of the Executive Director's normal working hours except in the event of an emergency requiring him to perform such duties during his normal working hours. Executive Director shall be entitled to additional compensation in the amount of \$3.50 for each graded lesson. Such additional compensation shall be issued to the Executive Director in accordance with the same procedures that apply to the Board's other teachers who receive compensation that is paid in this manner.
2. The remaining terms and conditions of the Executive Director's Contract and any addendums or amendments thereto, not addressed in this Addendum, shall remain in full force and effect unless otherwise modified in writing by the parties.
3. This Addendum shall be incorporated by reference herein to the Executive Director's Contract and be made a part thereof.

WHEREFORE, the parties have each set their hand hereunder in order to signify their intent to be bound by the foregoing.

Title: Gifted Coordinator

1. Master's Degree.
2. Valid supervisor's certificate; valid certificate for gifted education.
3. Preferred prior experience in gifted education.
4. Valid Ohio Driver's License.
5. Effective communication skills in English.
6. Access to own motor vehicle.
7. Ability to lift 40 pounds unassisted.
8. Ability to maneuver stairs unassisted.
9. Pass criminal background check.

General Duties: Under general direction, designs, develops, coordinates, and evaluates the gifted and talented programs; provides in-service programs; provides consultation regarding appropriate materials and teaching strategies; promotes related public relations activities.

Essential Functions:

1. Assists school personnel in the identification, evaluation, placement, and reassignment of gifted and talented children.
2. Provides in-service to parents, mentors, aides, administrators, and general education personnel regarding the education of gifted and talented children.
3. Provides consultation on appropriate materials and teaching strategies for use by classroom teachers in assisting gifted and talented children in the regular classroom.
4. Assists school personnel in determining which students should be included in enrichment activities, provided with differentiated instruction, or accelerated in grade level or subject area.
5. Coordinates activities for gifted and talented children which may include mentorships, advanced placement, the formation of special seminars, independent research, and other integrated curricular experiences.
6. Assists in the development of educational evaluation and accountability procedures, curriculum, and staff development and instructional or classroom management strategies.
7. Serves as liaison with school personnel, parents, community members, universities and colleges, industry, business, and cultural institutions and other interested publics.
8. Purchase materials deemed as appropriate for the needs of the gifted student population.
9. Carry materials to and from the districts as requested by the school districts.
10. Promotes public relations activities related to gifted at the local, county, regional, and state levels.

11. Maintains required certificate(s) and license(s).
12. Demonstrates regular and predictable attendance.
13. Attends appropriate workshops and professional meetings.
14. Performs all duties in conformity to the adopted Board Policy.
15. Displays professional appearance.
16. Performs in a professional manner.

Other Duties and Responsibilities:

1. Serves as a role model for educators and students in how to conduct themselves as citizens and as responsible, intelligent human beings.
2. Helps instill in students and staff the belief in and practice of ethical principles and democratic values.
3. Shall perform such other duties as the Governing Board may assign/determine.
4. The employee shall remain free of any alcohol or nonprescribed controlled substance abuse in the workplace throughout his/her employment in the County/District.
5. Observes Risk Reduction Safety Rules and Regulations of the Greater Ohio Virtual School and School Districts, State, Federal OSHA laws and will be evaluated to the extent of compliance and implementation as an employee of such rules and regulations for safety in the workplace while visiting such sites in line of work duties.

Governor DeWine Announces School Safety Grant Program Accepting Applications

Governor Mike DeWine announced today that the State is now accepting applications for \$53 million in grant funding for schools as part of his \$100 million Ohio K-12 School Safety Grant Program.

The Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC), in partnership with the [Ohio School Safety Center](#), is encouraging more than 4,000 eligible public schools, districts, and chartered non-public schools statewide to apply for the grant opportunity. Applicants can request up to \$100,000 per school building to cover expenses associated with physical security enhancements, such as security cameras, public address systems, automatic door locks, visitor badging systems, and exterior lighting.

The deadline to apply is Monday, October 3, 2022 at 11:59 P.M.

What can schools do with the money?

Schools can purchase and update items found on the Authorized Equipment List (AEL) for the 2022 grant. It is made up of Tier 1 items found on the Partner Alliance for Safer Schools checklist.

Federal Program Updates for September

Opportunities for Parent Participation

Did you know that schools are required to seek parent participation in the planning of Title I programs, and IDEA Part B planning? Schools are required to ensure parents have multiple opportunities to participate in the planning and implementation of these programs. Some schools post the opportunity to participate on their website. Federal law requires that schools utilize more than one means of notification. Schools can put an ad in the local paper, send notices home, put it on the board meeting announcements or perhaps utilize a calling tree. Be sure to keep copies of the methods you use to contact parents.

School Board Meetings

It is important to invite parents to school board meetings as parents are one of the school's most important stake holders. If your school board meets at the school, please make sure that the entrance to the school is unlocked or that someone is at the door to open it for parents. Board meetings are to be open to the public. Holding meetings behind closed school doors limits public access to the meeting.

Title III Notification

Schools must notify parents of students identified as English Learners of their students' level of English Acquisition and participation in the Title III program within 2 weeks of the first day of attendance. Remember that parents should receive notices in the language spoken at home.

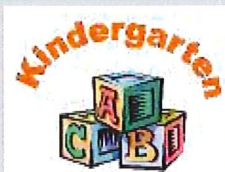
Carryover Funds

Final Expenditure Reports (FERs) are due on or before September 30th. Carryover funds will be allocated once the state accepts the FERs. Do you already have a plan on how the school wants to spend these carryover funds? If so, enter a history log note stating the school's intention of spending the funds. This will allow the school to start encumbering the funds prior to the carryover funds being loaded into the CCIP system. A history log note should state the areas of where the carryover funds will be budgeted. Here is an example of a history log note for Title I funds: Please note that the school will budget Title I carryover funds for the purpose of funding an instructional coach under Professional Development purchased services. Remember to send the history log note to the schools Office of Federal Programs consultant.

Utilizing a Management Company

If your school uses a management company, you may want to ensure that the governing body is fully participating in the handling of federal funds. One way to capture the governing board's active participation in federal funding is for members of the board to ask specific questions during board meetings. 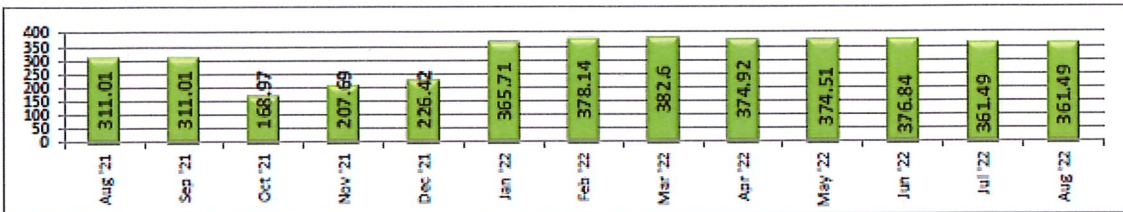

Contract Terms for Renewal Eligibility

Per Section 11.7 of its contract with St. Aloysius, Greater Ohio Virtual School is eligible for renewal if it:

- (1) Receives a grade of *Meets* or higher in at least one applicable grade card component for the most recent school year; or
- (2) Meets the criteria listed below:
 - a. An overall report card grade that is greater than three of the five comparison group schools, consisting of traditional public schools and charter schools with similar student demographics within 5-10 miles of the school, if possible:
 - i. Findlay Digital Academy
 - ii. Fairborn Digital
 - iii. Ohio Digital
 - iv. Auglaize County
 - v. Quaker Digital Academy

Definitions:

Overall School Rating - a combination of the school's high school test passage rate, gap closing component, progress component, and graduation rates form the school's overall rating.

Combined Graduation Rate - looks at the percentage of students who are successfully completing high school with a diploma in 4,5,6,7 and 8 years.

High School Test Passage Rate - represents the number of students who passed all five state tests that are required for graduation.

Progress - looks at the progress students in grades 9-12 are making in math and reading.

Gap Closing – reflects how well subgroups of students are meeting the state's performance expectations in reading, math and graduation rates.
