## SOUTH COUNTY TECH

South County Tech provides students with career and technical education (CTE) that prepares them for continuing education and the workforce. The 26 CTE majors allow students to explore their career interests while earning industry certifications, college and high school credit, and skills that will last a lifetime. Partial day schedules keep students engaged at Bayless High School academics and activities while they make new friends with similar interests from different area high schools.

## THE COLLEGE NOW PROGRAM

The College Now Program is an early entrance to college program located on the campus of St. Louis Community College (STLCC) - Meramec. Students can attend the College Now program for two years, replacing the junior and senior years of traditional high school. While participating in College Now, students are enrolled in a curriculum consisting of all college coursework taught by professors at STLCC - Meramec. Upon successful completion of the entire program, students earn the 42 General Transfer Block as well as a high school diploma. College Now students are able to take summer courses in order to earn an Associate's Degree concurrent with their high school diploma.

## STL CAPS

STL CAPS is an opportunity for high school juniors and seniors to fast-forward beyond college to test-drive their future in high-skill, high-demand professions. Students engage in a profession-based experience located outside the walls of a traditional classroom. They learn directly from business partners in professional workplaces such as medical centers, research labs, and co-working spaces. Students truly begin to build their professional network while still in high school and have the opportunity to complete internships with business

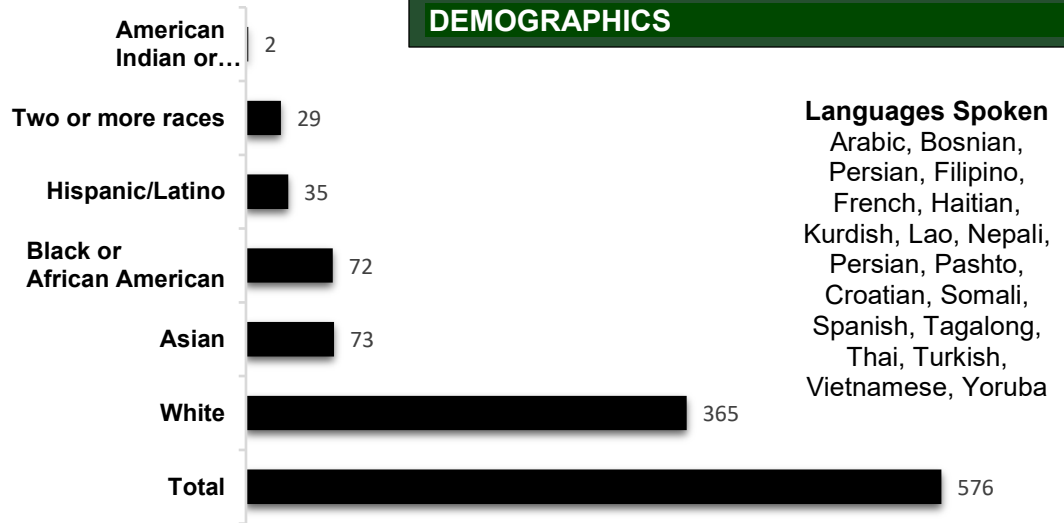
# Bayless High School
