# **Guiding Principles of the Counseling Programme**

### The work of the University and College Counselor at ABA is aligned with the school's Mission, Vision and Values

#### **Mission: Empowering Students to Make Informed Choices**

We provide students with quality information about Higher Education and career options so that they can make choices which involve exploring their passions whilst contributing meaningfully to society and achieving personal fulfillment.

### **<u>Vision:</u>** Providing Personalized Support for All

Students receive ongoing advice from Grade 9 -12 which allows them: to have a better understanding of themselves as learners and as people who relate to others in the world; to know under which conditions they will flourish; to understand the world-wide study options that are open to them; and to be thoroughly prepared for the application process. The counseling department will also provide advice and support for those students who do not wish to make a direct entry to university. Students are encouraged to consider their wider options such as taking a Gap Year, exploring creative or vocational courses, or undertaking an apprenticeship.

#### **Values:** working with Students and Families

While it is anticipated that students will ultimately make the choice and follow a pathway that is in line with their various skills, talents and aptitude, the process for career and university planning should ideally involve families. Decisions about where and what students leave home to study need to be discussed together.

## **Applying to the United Kingdom - Further Information**

#### **Academic Programmes**

The UK offers a vast range of post-secondary education courses. There will be something to suit every interest, but for the most part these are specialist degree courses. Undergraduate study in the UK takes three years (four years in Scotland), one year less than in both the US and Canada. Students applying to the UK need to make sure they take the correct combination of subjects to meet entry requirements. While entry requirements are specific to each institution, there are some general points to bear in mind: students should meet the Math and Science requirements if they are thinking of studying any Science subject, Economics, Engineering or Psychology. The most competitive science and engineering courses will want to see Math taken at Higher Level. Students applying for direct entry onto degree courses will apply through UCAS, which is the central organizing body for applications: <a href="https://www.ucas.com">www.ucas.com</a>

#### **Foundation Courses**

Students may also apply for Foundation Courses which provide a preparatory period of study for students who may not have either the grades, or the correct subject combination, or perhaps the language ability (less likely at ABA) for direct entry. The foundation course is normally one year long, and if students progress well through the course (maintaining something in the order of 75% in their regular assessments), they will automatically be admitted onto the degree programme of their choice. Foundation courses represent a very effective route through to a highly ranked university. Some foundation courses can be applied for online through UCAS, but many have a direct application through the university's website.

**Application Requirements for Students**

Request a short reference from three or four of your teachers. These teachers should be able to speak about your skills, interest, and suitability for the course you have applied to. Set up an account with UCAS. You will need a username, password, school e-mail and school 'buzzword' (ask Ms. Jinane for this). Fill in as many general details as possible, including contact details and educational qualifications. Enter all MYP grades, any music exams and International Award certificates. ## **Applying to the United States – Further Information**

#### The US offers 4-year Undergraduate Courses

The US offers a vast range of post-secondary education courses – there are over 4,000 Universities and Colleges in the US. Colleges only offer undergraduate degrees and all Universities offer post-graduate qualifications (Masters and PhDs). Students applying to the US will mostly need to complete standardized tests and a language proficiency test to meet entry requirements. While there are some US Universities that do not require the ACT or SAT for entry, the vast majority still do, and therefore a decision to apply to the US should be accompanied by a determined approach to studying for the SAT or ACT.

Students applying to the US will normally apply through the Common Application process (<a href="www.commonapp.org">www.commonapp.org</a>) which is the most widely used application system in the US. The alternative is the Coalition Application process, which 150 US Universities are signed up with (<a href="www.coalitionforcollegeaccess.org/">www.coalitionforcollegeaccess.org/</a>). The Coalition App allows for slightly more flexibility in what students can supply as evidence in support of their applications, but they are both equally efficient and user friendly. The good thing is that students get started on the administrative side of their applications in Grade 11, therefore reducing the stress in Grade 12!

#### **Application Requirements**

- 1. A completed Common App or Coalition Application, which will include:
- 2. A thoughtful, carefully written essay of 650 words (Titles available on Common App website).
- 3. A school transcript showing semester grades from each subject area from Grades 9 12.
- 4. ACT or SAT (good to have even if not required).
- 5. Proof of Language Proficiency IELTs or TOEFL.
- 6. Predicted Grades of the IB DP or IB Courses.
- 7. At least 2 Teacher recommendations and 1 Counselor recommendation.
- 8. A set of strong extra-curricular activities, summer experiences or ongoing learning where possible.

#### What does it take to get into a Highly Selective University in the US

Highly selective universities which include such colleges as Stanford, MIT as well as the Ivy Leagues (Brown, Columbia, Cornell, Dartmouth, University of Pennsylvania, Princeton, Harvard and Yale) are extraordinarily difficult to get into because the admission rates are very small (particularly for international schools). While anybody can apply, it is worth bearing in mind certain essential factors to ensure that the application is not a waste of the admission fee. It is important to know that it is not enough to be best in the class, or best in your school – to be admitted to highly selective universities you need to be 'Best in the World' in a particular area.

- ✓ Best to make the university your clear favorite and apply Early Decision (ED). Ensure you know the college inside out. Visit if at all possible!
- ✓ Make sure you already have excellent SAT scores to send in late September or Early October. See <a href="https://www.collegeboard.org">www.collegeboard.org</a> for testing dates. 1500 /1600 would be a low cut off.
- ✓ Make sure you have taken an IELTS or TOEFL language test (<u>www.idpielts.me</u>)
- ✓ Your GPA should be in the region of 6.5 or above your transcript should be predominantly filled with 7s (the odd 6 won't count against you too much)
- ✓ Spend your summers learning new courses, skills, or consolidating old ones.
- ✓ Decide what your 'Unique Selling Point' or distinguishing skill /virtue is going to be and work to show how that sets you apart from others.
- ✓ Read widely and avariciously this is the best way to expose yourself to superior writing that will inform your own style on the Common App Essay.

Request a letter of recommendation from 2 - 4 teachers (check university requirements). Provide a CV or detailed list of achievements. Teachers should be able to speak to both your academic achievement, potential as well as your character.	June - September	Fill out ABA letter of recommendation form. You should note the universities - if highly selective or applying ED or AD you should say what makes you an excellent match for that university.
Start your application through the Common App or Coalition.  Begin the first draft of your essay. This will probably need three or four iterations. It is really important so give it plenty of time!	May - June	Share with family or friends for input but tell your own story and tell it from your heart.  Do not be tempted to let others have too much influence.
Finish your application and submit it early. The deadline is usually December / January (between Dec 15th - January 15th) but aim to have it completed by October. You will shine simply by being early!	September - December	Pay special attention to grammar and spelling and make sure every section is filled in with as much detail as possible.
