About DIS

- · Founded in 1987; joined Mission Laïque Française (MLF) in 1991 under the name Dallas International School
- · The only international PreK-12 French-English bilingual school in the Dallas Fort-Worth metroplex area
- · French international programs and IB curriculum in a multilingual and intercultural environment
- Total enrollment: 603 students 405 primary students (PreK to 5th grade); 198 secondary students (6th to 12th)
- · 35 nationalities represented among the student body

Upper School Overview

- · All core academic courses should be considered "honors" level
- DIS does not rank; all GPAs at DIS are unweighted; DIS follows a semester system
- · All students prepare for either the French Baccalaureate Diploma or the International Baccalaureate Diploma and the Texas High School Diploma
- · In the French track, all 9th graders take the Brevet, a set of worldwide subject-specific French examinations administered by the French Ministry of Education.
- DIS graduates exceed the expectation of the State of Texas Distinguished Achievement Program (DAP) Graduation requirements
- · 11 Varsity Sports; 11 clubs and activities; 5 Honor Societies
- · Class of 2023: 16 students | 9 French Baccalaureate Program | 7 International Baccalaureate Program

French Baccalaureate



- · All courses are taught in French unless otherwise noted
- The baccalaureate diploma is awarded upon passing the FB exams and successfully completing all required courses and assignments
- 1-20 point grading system. US equivalent is obtained through a specific scale and not by multiplying by 5 to reach a scale of 100
- · Overall average of 16+ is considered "Exceptional"
- 10 is the minimum average score required to earn the French Baccalaureate

International Baccalaureate



- The IB Diploma is contingent upon passing the IB exams and successfully completing all required courses and assignments
- · DIS uses the US 1-100 grading scale
- · Lowest passing grade is 70
- A maximum of 45 points can be awarded to an IB student; 42 points generated across the 6 subjects and 3 points derived from Theory of Knowledge (TOK) and the Extended Essay (EE)
- 24 is the minimum score required to earn the IB diploma
