PAYING FOR SCHOOL MEALS

Fairfield Local offers simple payment options for you to choose from.

- Pay Online: Make an online payment with <u>MY SCHOOL BUCKS</u>. Use your computer or smartphone to make payments, view your child's account balance or see what they're eating! Visit <u>www.myschoolbucks.com</u> to register.
- 2. Pay by Mail: Send a check to the school payable to "Fairfield Local Food Service". Please include your child's name and ID number. (11611 St. Rt. 771 Leesburg, Ohio 45135)
- 3. Pay in Person/Send Payment to School: Stop by the school office during school hours to pay by cash or check. Or send cash or check to school with your child. Please place in envelope with child's name and ID number on the outside.

We encourage parents to create a "safety net" for their child. Pre-paying for your child's meals prevents unpaid meal charges. Paying for meals ahead of time also helps lines move more quickly, giving children more time to enjoy their lunch break.

If your child's account falls below \$0, you will be notified with an automated call. If the account goes to -\$5.00, the student will receive an *alternate meal* (cheese sandwich or PBJ, fruit, veggie and milk). The student will receive alternate meals until the account is in good standing. No a-la-carte or extra items can be charged.

CHANGE TO ELEMENTARY BREAKFAST

Students in grades K-4 will be served breakfast in the new elementary kitchen this school year and will eat in the cafeteria. Car and bus riders who want breakfast will be allowed into the building a few minutes early.

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

(FERPA) and Ohio law generally prohibit the disclosure of personally identifiable information from students' education records without prior consent. An exception exists in both federal and Ohio law to allow publishing directory information in places such as the yearbook, honor roll, graduation program or sports rosters. "Directory Information" is information generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released. The following can be designated as directory information: student's name, address, telephone number, email address, date and place of birth, dates of attendance, grade level, sports participation, degrees, honors, awards and weight/height of members of athletic team participants.

If you do not want Fairfield Local School District to disclose directory information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, you must notify the District in writing by September 1st.

The US Department of Agriculture prohibits discrimination against its customers, employees and applicants for employment on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, disability, sex, gender identity, religion, reprisal and where applicable, political beliefs, marital status, familial or parental status, sexual orientation, or all or part of an individual's income is derived from any public assistance program, or protected genetic information in employment or in any program or activity conducted or funded by the Department. (Not all prohibit basis will apply to all programs and/or employment activities.)

The *Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act* affords parents and students who are 18 years of age or older ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are:

- •The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days after the day the Fairfield Local School District ("School") receives a request for access.
- •The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights under FERPA.
- •The right to provide written consent before the school discloses personally identifiable information (PII) from the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

LOCKERS

Under Ohio Revised Code 3313.20, "all lockers are the property of the Board of Education and lockers and their contents are subject to random search at any time without regard to whether there is reasonable suspicion that any locker or its contents contains evidence of a violation of a criminal statute or a school rule."

Child Find Policy The Fairfield Local School District's adopted Child Find Policy requires that all children below twenty-two (22) years of age residing within the district, who have a disability regardless of the severity of the disability, and who are in need of special education and related services are identified, located, and evaluated in accordance with all federal regulations and state standards.

For children birth through age two, a disability means that a child has a behavior, cognition, communication, physical development, sensory development and/or social or emotional development deficit.

For children age three through five years of age, a disability means that a child has a documented deficit in one or more of the following areas: communication skills, hearing abilities, motor functioning, social emotional/behavior functioning or vision abilities.

For school-age children, a disability means a person having one or more conditions such as autism, developmental handicap, hearing handicap, multi-handicap, orthopedically and/or other health handicaps, emotional/behavior handicap, specific learning disability, traumatic brain injury or vision handicap.

If you are aware of a child who you think may have a disability, contact the Director of Special Programs at 937-780-2977.

Elementary Parent Notification

As a recipient of Federal Title 1 funding, Fairfield Elementary is required to notify parents of elementary students of their right to know about the professional qualifications of our elementary teachers. You have the right to know:

- If the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade level and subject areas being taught.
- If the teacher is teaching under a temporary or emergency status in which state qualifications or licensing are waived.
- The teacher's baccalaureate degree major, graduate licensure, and field of discipline
- Whether the student is provided services by paraprofessionals, and, if so, their qualifications.

SAFETY, SECURITY & COMMUNICATION



SchoolMessenger

The Fairfield Local School District is excited to announce that we have changed our messaging system from *One Call Now* to *SchoolMessenger*. *SchoolMessenger* is an automated notification service that will give us more flexibility and options than our previous system. We will be using this system for closings, delays, athletic events, school activities, absences and lunchroom account notifications.

For *SchoolMessenger* to operate effectively, we need accurate contact information for our students. This includes any/all phone numbers that should be called. Some messages can also be sent to an email address or as a text message (not all messages have this option).

If at any time your phone numbers change, you will need to notify the school immediately so you will continue to receive the *SchoolMessenger* notification calls.

The *SchoolMessenger* system is a secure, passwordprotected service and is accessible only by school administration. All information is kept confidential and used only by Fairfield Local School District.

SCHOOL PARKING LOT SAFETY

Here are a few safety tips that drivers should observe in the school parking lots:

- •Obey the speed limit and traffic rules

- •Be courteous to other drivers

SECURITY MEASURES CURRENTLY IN PLACE

- NEW Emergency Activation System (internal/external warning lights and sirens)
- All exterior doors locked
- ◊ Main entrances video/audio intercom system
- Video surveillance throughout school

In addition to the routine fire and tornado drills, Fairfield students will be participating in Lockdown and Evacuation drills during the school year. These drills are unannounced and are intended to simulate a real emergency situation. Local law enforcement and other emergency personnel may take part in these drills. SCHOOL BUS SAFETY

- Be at bus stop at least 10 minutes early. The bus will not wait.
- \bullet Wait for your bus in a safe place 20 feet away from a roadway.
 - Don't play around at the bus stop.
 - ♦ If you drop something under the bus LEAVE IT and tell the bus driver.
 - ♦ After school go directly home. Don't play along the way.

On the bus:

- ♦ Use handrail when boarding.
- ♦Go directly to seat/stay seated.
- ♦ Keep aisles and exits clear.
- ♦ Keep head and arms inside the bus.
- ♦ Keep your things in your lap.
- ♦NO eating or drinking on the bus.
- •Obey and respect the bus driver.
- Ride quietly. No bad language.
- •Be respectful to others.
- ♦No throwing objects in/out of bus.
