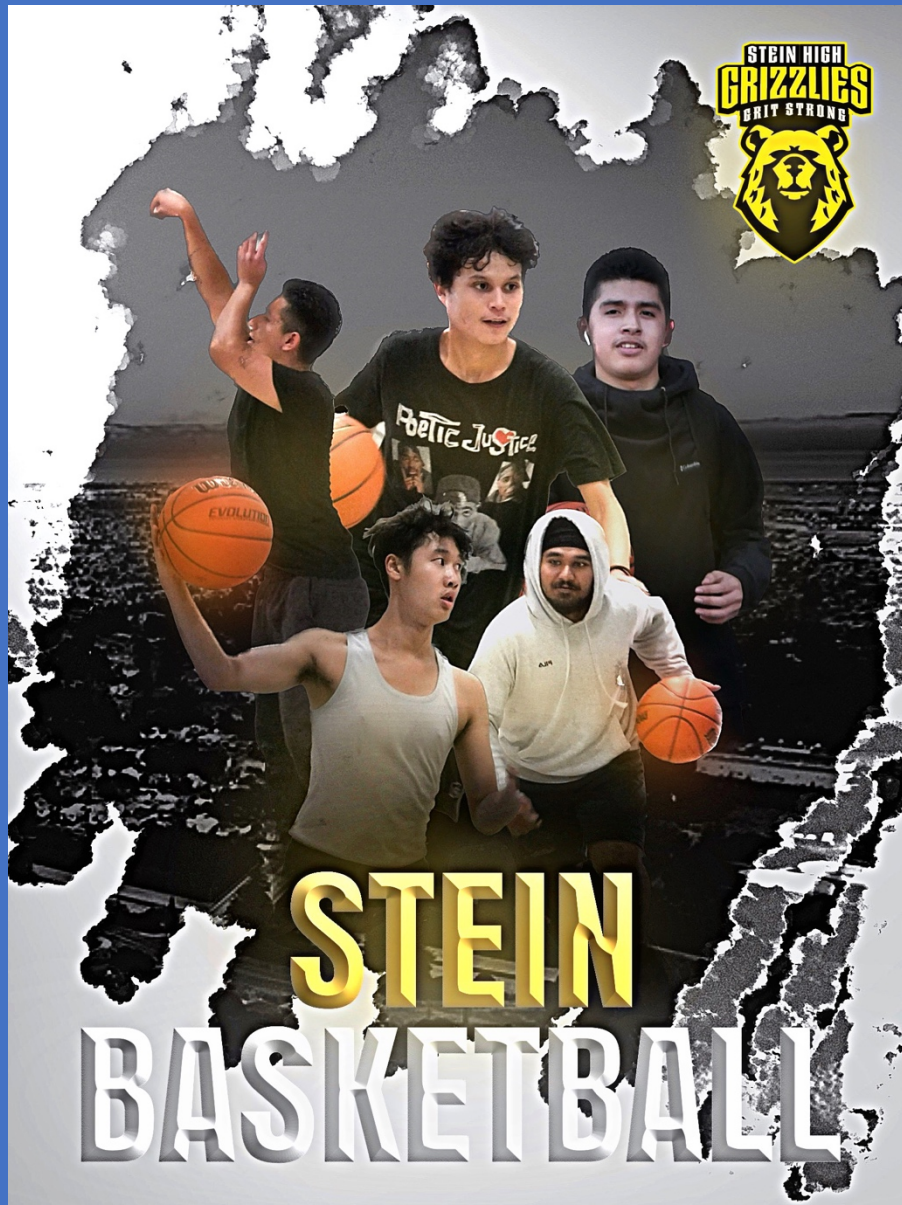
Bathroom upkeep

MUSIC SPOTLIGHT

TODAY I AM GOING TO TALK ABOUT MUSIC. THE GENRE WILL BE CLASSICAL MUSIC AND THE COMPOSER I WILL BE TALKING ABOUT IS FRÉDÉRIC CHOPIN. CHOPIN IS A POLISH COMPOSER AND VIRTUOSO PIANIST OF THE ROMANTIC PERIOD. WHO WROTE PRIMARILY FOR SOLO PIANO. CHOPIN WROTE FAMOUS PIECES LIKE NOCTURNE OP.9 NO.2, ETC. CHOPIN FIRST STARTED WRITING MUSIC AT THE YOUTHFUL AGE OF 7 AND BEGAN PERFORMING A YEAR LATER. IN 1832, HE MOVED TO PARIS, SOCIALIZED WITH HIGH SOCIETY AND WAS KNOWN AS AN EXCELLENT PIANO TEACHER. HIS PIANO COMPOSITIONS WERE HIGHLY INFLUENTIAL. HIS FATHER'S EMPLOYMENT EXPOSED YOUNG CHOPIN TO CULTURED WARSAW SOCIETY, AND HIS MOTHER INTRODUCED HIM TO MUSIC AT AN EARLY AGE. BY AGE 6, CHOPIN WAS ABLE TO PLAY THE PIANO AND COMPOSE TUNES. RECOGNIZING HIS TALENT, HIS FAMILY ENGAGED PROFESSIONAL MUSICIAN WOJCIECH ZYŹNY FOR LESSONS, AND SOON THE PUPIL SURPASSED THE TEACHER IN BOTH TECHNIQUE AND IMAGINATION.
