From the Superintendent - Mr. Tim Dettwiller

Hi folks,

The 2018-2019 school year was my first as your school Superintendent. And what a year it was. I was fortunate to witness many firsts for Fairfield. We had our first ever state champion in Brandtson Duffie and our first outright Del Yockey all sports award for our athletic program.

Academically, the Board of Education approved our first curriculum adoption in over 15 years. With this adoption we now have a current and relevant English Language Arts K-12 curriculum. We also have our first Curriculum adoption cycle in place to insure that all subject areas will be addressed over the next 4 years. The Board of Education approved the purchase of over 300 Chromebooks which brings our tech tools fleet to the highest number we have ever had.

A critical piece to improving our educational program is the implementation of our "Path to Excellence" plan. This plan calls for Teacher Based Teams (TBT) in all subject areas to meet on a regular basis to analyze student data with the expressed purpose of modifying instruction to meet the needs of the individual student. Another key component to this plan is for each building to have a Building Level Team (BLT) that monitors the work being completed by the teacher teams. This monitoring insures that all teams are functioning properly and are addressing student needs. These teams will have time to complete their work now as we added more early release dates to the school calendar.

You may notice the campus and facilities have undergone many changes over the summer. First and foremost the leaks in our buildings are now gone as our roof project was completed. This \$500,000 project was a large investment that insured the long-term integrity of our buildings. We also had the HS and MS entry ways and drop off areas repaved. Yellow striping was added to theses curbs to remind folks that these are not parking areas but are simply for dropping off students and guests. We also installed a paved walking path connecting the stadium parking lot with the ball fields. These projects would not be possible without the financial support of our community. It is easy sometimes to forget who pays for these projects that's why I say on behalf of the school THANK YOU for your support!

A new security feature installed over the summer is Threat Extinguisher. This product is a non-lethal pepper spray that all staff and eventually students will be trained to use. In the event of an intruder the canister is removed from its station by an employee or a student. Upon the canisters removal first responders are contacted alerting them to the threat. The user simply aims the canister (size of a spray can) at the intruder and pulls the spray trigger. Threat Extinguisher sprays up to 20 feet and is a very accurate gel. The safety of our students and staff is our number one priority.

We are in the process of revising our strategic plan and are looking for community members who are interested in serving on this crucial committee. Strategic planning allows for the community and school to jointly determine what knowledge and traits a student from Fairfield Local Schools will possess upon graduation. We will meet monthly beginning in August and will continue through October. If you are interested please email me at tim.dettwiller@fairfieldlocal.org.


From the Treasurer - Mr. Mike Morrow

area that includes twelve high schools in and around our region. The teachers did a remarkable job preparing students for these tests as well as the addition of a math tutor that was utilized several months prior to testing. We will also be expanding our course selections by including numerous online courses that students will be able to access at school and receive credit for graduation. We will also be having a one-day workshop to prepare our juniors for the ACT Test that will take place in the spring. We also include ACT Prep days during the course of the school year to help prepare our students for this test.

We would be hard pressed to find a year where we had as much student growth as we did this past year. Our students conducted themselves as mature young adults on a daily basis. The number of disciplinary incidents were very low as our students grew each and every day. We look forward to that same type of respect and cooperation in the upcoming school year.
