## A Message from the Superintendent...

I would like to welcome everybody back for the 2015-16 school year. We extend a warm welcome to all our new students and families and are very pleased to have you with us. It is my hope that everyone had an enjoyable summer. It seems to go by so quickly! This upcoming year, like all others, promises to be both exciting and challenging. The summer has been a flurry of activity around the building. The custodial and maintenance departments have been working diligently to get the building ready for the school year. All areas have had an extensive cleaning, the floors have been waxed, and new paint has been added.

I would like welcome to all of our new staff members. We are sure they will be great additions to the staff and help to continue our tradition of excellence. You can find a listing of all new personnel in this edition of the Focus on Fairfield.

The 2014-15 school year was another great year academically. We have received preliminary testing data and we expect to do very well once again. To date we have received our OGT scores and our students have passed all five subject areas with flying colors. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade OAA preliminary results indicate nearly 90% passage and no students will be retained under the 3rd Grade Reading Guarantee. More results are scheduled to be returned during school year.

As Stephen Covey tells us, you must begin with the end in mind. With that said we have set several goals for the upcoming school year. We want to continue our proud tradition of high student achievement and increase overall passage rates on state-mandated testing. We want to continue to utilize tax-payer monies as efficiently as possible and keep at least 100 days true cash available. Lastly, we want to increase the opportunities for students to earn college level credit through dual enrollment, access to on-site distance learning and course offerings, and off-site opportunities as well.

Now for a quick update on the Construction Project. We have been meeting bi-monthly with the architects to get the building and track designed and ready for bid. The principals, Athletic Director, teachers, technology department, and maintenance staff have been involved throughout the discussions. By the time this is published we should have our General Contractor on board and begin the bidding for the various trades involved. I ask for your patience throughout this school year as we will at times need to close off sections of the building, parking lots, and use alternative entrances. We are still optimistic that September of 2016 will be our move in date.

This year as in the past we will be utilizing Waiver Days for teacher professional development. Our master calendar will reflect these days. The waiver days allow for teachers to continue to get required and necessary training and in -service so they can best meet the needs of our learners.

## <u>Please be sure to check the bus routes and schedules in this addition of Focus on Fairfield.</u> Several routes have changed for this school year.

As always we look forward to working with your student and hope that their school year will be a great success in many ways. Again, welcome back and feel free to call or stop in the office any time you have a question or concern.

## Child Find Policy

The Fairfield Local School District's adopted Child Find Policy requires that all children below twenty-two (22) years of age residing within the district, who have a disability regardless of the severity of the disability, and who are in need of special education and related services are identified, located, and evaluated in accordance with all federal regulations and state standards.

For children birth through age two, a disability means that a child has a behavior, cognition, communication, physical development, sensory development and/or social or emotional development deficit.

For children age three through five years of age, a disability means that a child has a documented deficit in one or more of the following areas: communication skills, hearing abilities, motor functioning, social emotional/behavior functioning or vision abilities.

For school-age children, a disability means a person having one or more conditions such as autism, developmental handicap, hearing handicap, multi-handicap, orthopedically and/or other health handicaps, emotional/behavior handicap, specific learning disability, traumatic brain injury or vision handicap.

## **Elementary Parent Notification**

As a recipient of Federal Title 1 funding, Fairfield Elementary is required to notify parents of elementary students of their right to know about the professional qualifications of our elementary teachers. You have the right to know:

- If the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade level and subject areas being taught.
- If the teacher is teaching under a temporary or emergency status in which state qualifications or licensing are waived.
- The teacher's baccalaureate degree major, graduate licensure, and field of discipline
- Whether the student is provided services by paraprofessionals, and, if so, their qualifications.

## SCHOOL PARKING LOT SAFETY

Here are a few safety tips that drivers should observe in the school parking lots:

- •Obey the speed limit and traffic rules
- •Obey the school's drop-off and pick up rules
- •Be courteous to other drivers
- •Look both ways in the parking lot
- •Do not run/play in the parking lot
- •Respect school staff who enforce traffic rules

#### The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

(FERPA) and Ohio law generally prohibit the disclosure of personally identifiable information from students' education records without prior consent. An exception exists in both federal and Ohio law to allow publishing directory information in places such as the yearbook, honor roll, graduation program or sports rosters. "Directory Information" is information generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released. The following can be designated as directory information: student's name, address, telephone number, email address, date and place of birth, dates of attendance, grade level, sports participation, degrees, honors, awards and weight/height of members of athletic team participants.

If you do not want Fairfield Local School District to disclose directory information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, you must notify the District in writing by September 1<sup>st</sup>.

## **ONE CALL SYSTEM**

In the event of an emergency situation, Fairfield Schools will utilize the One Call system as the means for notification to parents and guardians.

I lt is very important that any changes to phone numbers be communicated to the building secretary so that the call list can be kept current.

In addition to the routine fire and tornado drills, Fairfield students will be participating in Lockdown and Evacuation drills during the school year. These drills are unannounced and are intended to simulate a real emergency situation. Local law enforcement and other emergency personnel may take part in these drills. At the completion of a lockdown/evacuation drill, a One Call message will be sent to all families indicating that a drill has taken place.

#### **LOCKERS**

Under Ohio Revised Code 3313.20, "all lockers are the property of the Board of Education and lockers and their contents are subject to random search at any time without regard to whether there is reasonable suspicion that any locker or its contents contains evidence of a violation of a criminal statute or a school rule."

(FERPA) The *Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act* affords parents and students who are 18 years of age or older ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are:

- •The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days after the day the Fairfield Local School District ("School") receives a request for access.
- •The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights under FERPA.
- •The right to provide written consent before the school discloses personally identifiable information (PII) from the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

## ~~ ELEMENTARY AFTERNOON DISMISSAL ~~

- ◆ Parents must call prior to 2pm with any changes to transportation, including parent pick-up (unless an emergency).
- Parents/guardians should park in the back parking lot and report to the sidewalk with a photo id.
- A staff member will radio inside for the student to be dismissed.
- No child will be allowed to enter the parking lot area unattended.
- Students being picked up early for afternoon appointments must be signed-out in the elementary office.
- Students being picked-up prior to 3:25 will be counted as a "leave early" and will reflect on their attendance record.

## **ELEMENTARY BUS RIDERS - AFTERNOON DROP-OFF**

Students in grades K-4 will not be dismissed from the bus at the end of the day unless a parent/guardian is present and visible from the bus. Students without someone to receive them will remain on the bus and be returned to the elementary office for parent pick-up.

## SCHOOL BUS SAFETY

CHOO

Parents - please review bus safety with your child.

At the bus stop:

- Be at bus stop at least 10 minutes early. The bus will not wait for you.
- $\bullet$  Wait for your bus in a safe place 20 feet away from a roadway.
- Don't play around at the bus stop.
- ♦ If you drop something under the bus LEAVE IT and tell the bus driver.
- ♦ After school go directly home. Don't play along the way.

#### On the bus:

- ♦ Use handrail when boarding.
- ♦Go directly to your seat/stay seated. ♦Ride quietly.
- Keep aisles and exits clear.
- Keep head and arms inside the bus.
- Keep your things in your lap.
- ♦ NO eating or drinking on the bus.
- Obey and respect the bus driver.
- Be respectful to others.
- ♦ No throwing objects in/out of bus.
- ♦No bad language.




