AMERICA FACES GROWING TERROR THREAT

On December 2nd, a couple opened fire at a holiday party at the Inland Regional Center in San Bernardino. Together, they killed 14 and injured 21 people. Most of these people were county employees. The couple, Tashfeen Malik and Syed Rizwan Farook, was killed in a gun battle with the police. A friend of Farook's, Enrique Marquez, bought the couple the two guns which were used in the attack. Farook and Malik began plotting a terror attack before they were engaged and before Malik moved to the U.S. last year. Investigators are trying to figure out whether or not they had links to foreign terror organizations. The Inland Regional Center won't be reopening until sometime next year due to the massacre. The terrorist attacks are getting out of hand. This hasn't been the first attack and it most certainly won't be the last.

President Barack Obama made a statement on this terrible massacre. He made many points, claiming that there isn't much information to give and how terrible the attacks were. Mr.

Obama stated "Our nation has been at war with terrorists since al Qaeda killed nearly 3,000 Americans on 9/11. In the process, we've hardened our defenses -- from airports to financial centers, to other critical infrastructure. Intelligence and law enforcement agencies have disrupted countless plots here and overseas, and worked around the clock to keep us safe."

Radical Islamic terrorist activity has been a major problem not only the United States, but all over the world. The first major terrorist attack was when Al-Qaeda placed a bomb in the basement of the world trade center on February 26, 1993. Then, one of the biggest known terrorist attacks in history, the destruction of the world trade center happened on September 11, 2001. 2,977 people were killed on that tragic day. Also, the Paris attacks on the evening of the 13th of November caused about 130 deaths. These malicious acts need to stop for the sake of our people. Flint residents protest the contaminated water

Flint, Michigan has a problem with its water: it's full of lead. In 2014, the state decided to switch its water source from Lake Huron to the Flint River. The people started complaining immediately about the taste, color, and odor. It tasted sweet and was a disgusting brown color. Researchers took samples and discovered that it had elevated levels of lead. They switched back to Lake Huron but the lead was still present. Recently, Michigan governor Rick Snyder and President Barack Obama declared a state of emergency. President Obama contributed federal money to improve the situation. "To you, the people of Flint, I want to say tonight, as I have before, I am sorry, and I will fix it," Snyder said. Based on an analysis of Census data, every child in Flint under the age of six - 8,657 in total - have most likely been exposed to lead.

The people of Flint have been protesting to get their clean water back, saying that the lead is going to affect their children's brain development. It

has been proven that lead does actually affect IQ, attention span, and behavior. It also causes pregnant women to have miscarriages and premature births. Some residents have been told by their doctors that they have lead poisoning. One example is Rabecka Cordell and her young son, who were told they had it. "It's ridiculous," she says. At least 10 people have died from lead poisoning as a result of this incident. To fix this mess the pipes must be replaced, which will cost about \$1.5 billion.

Cher and Icelandic Glacial have donated over 180,000 bottles of water to the people of Flint. These celebrities and big companies have really made a difference for the citizens. By donating, they may have saved a few lives At press time, the media reported that even using a filter on the faucet wasn't enough to make the drinking water safe for the people of Flint. This event has been very unfortunate and hopefully will be resolved soon. The residents of Flint deserve clean water after this terrible incident that might affect them for the rest of their lives.



Minecraft

According to the Minecraft website and Minecraft wiki, Minecraft was originally created by Markus Persson, who you might know as Notch. On November 19th, 2011, Jens Bergensten, who you might know as Jeb, took over creative control so Markus could concentrate on new things. Markus Persson quit his job as an established games developer and as a result, Minecraft was born. Markus' original idea wasn't as fully featured as the Minecraft you play today. This was a game about placing and breaking blocks in a 3D world. Gameplay involves players interacting with the game world by placing and breaking various types of blocks in a three-dimensional environment. In this environment, players can build creative structures, creations, and artwork on multiplayer servers and single player worlds. Minecraft is available to all players for €19.95 (US\$26.95, £17.32). When purchased, single player and multiplayer game modes can be played using the downloadable stand-alone launcher. The official demo is free, but has a time limit. Minecraft development started around May 10, 2009, and pre-orders for the full game started being accepted on June 13, 2009. Minecraft's official release date was November 18, 2011. On September 20, 2014, Minecraft for the computer became the best-selling PC game of all time. On February 11, 2013, Minecraft: Pi Edition was released for the Raspberry Pi. It is based on the Pocket Edition and is available for free at Mojang's dedicated blog. The Pi Edition is intended as an educational tool for novice programmers and users are encouraged to open and change the game's code. On June 26, 2014, the Xbox 360 & PlayStation 3 editions' sales surpassed the number of sales for the PC edition of Minecraft. The Minecraft series has sold more than 54 million copies world-wide and become the third best-selling video game

of all time. On September 15, 2014, Mojang AB and all of its assets (including Minecraft) were purchased by Microsoft for \$2.5 billion. On July 29, 2015, Minecraft was released for the universal Windows 10 platform as an adaptation of the Pocket Edition. The demo mode is a demo version of Minecraft for users who have not purchased the game yet and would like to try it out first, designed to replace the functionality of the outdated PC Gamer Minecraft demo. Demo can be played by both paid players and players that are just try out the game.

Minecraft was created by developers but you can make your own mini games in it. Minecraft graphics relate to Legos. Minecraft has mini game servers like mineplex, hypixel, and minetime. Some people like the servers because they find it stimulating to play with multiple people from around the world. Some people find it to be a fun educational game. In single player mode, players have to gather natural resources (such as wood and stone) found in the environment in order to craft certain blocks and items. Depending on the difficulty, monsters spawn in darker areas in a certain radius of the character, requiring the player to build a shelter at night. The mode also features a health bar which is depleted by attacks from monsters, falls, drowning, falling into lava, suffocation, starvation, and other events. Players also have a hunger bar, which must be periodically refilled by eating food in-game, except in "Peaceful" difficulty, in which the hunger bar does not drain. If the hunger bar is depleted, automatic healing will stop and eventually health will deplete. Health replenishes when players have a nearly full hunger bar, and also regenerates regardless of fullness if players play on the easiest difficulty. If you go on realms you can make and play a server with your friends. For these reasons Minecraft is one of the best games.

I would like my students to never, ever give up and never, ever say they are finished when writing. That is bad language kids!


Tell us about your background before coming to Highlands.
