Parents and 8th grade students, it's time to start thinking about high school course registration

Below are some **IMPORTANT DATES** and **ACTIVITIES** that will assist both students and parents in this important process.

8th Grade School Visit: Scheduled for **Monday, January 9, 2023**, eighth grade students from John Muir, parochial schools, and home schoolers will be touring Wausau West and visiting department leaders in the elective areas. This will provide students the opportunity to ask questions and see what Wausau West High School is like. While students are visiting Wausau West, the West Counselors will explain the registration process, and will be available throughout January to assist with the registration process.

8th Grade Student Registration: January 9-13, 2023, is the 8th grade student registration period. 8th grade students will make course selections for their freshman year. Contact your Wausau West Counselor to answer questions during the 8th Grade registration process in January.

8th Grade Parents' Night: Parents are invited to meet with department leaders on **Monday, January 9, 2023 at 6:00 p.m.** in the West High Auditorium. This evening is planned to help you assist your student in course selections. We look forward to meeting you and introducing you to Wausau West High School. After a brief presentation by the elective departments, all department chairs will be available to answer your questions in the Commons area.

ADVISOR/ADVISEE Night Monday, February 6, 2023

Advisor/Advisee Night is a time for high school parents and students who are currently in 9th, 10th and 11th grades to meet with their homeroom advisor to discuss goals and finalize course selections. During the week of **January 9th** a message will be sent home to schedule a time to meet between 4:00-8:00 p.m. on February 6, 2023.

The following questions will help generate discussion with your child prior to Advisor/Advisee Night:

1. Have you signed up for the courses that are required for next year?
2. Are you taking elective courses of high interest and rigor appropriate?
3. Have you thought about what you would like to do after you graduate?
4. If you're thinking of college or technical college, do you know what courses you need to meet admission requirements?
5. What courses can you take to help you prepare for your future?
6. Have you read the Career Pathway information and course descriptions in the **Career Planning/Course Registration Handbook**?

PLANNING 2023-2024 COURSE REGISTRATION INFORMATION

When planning course registrations for next year, please keep in mind our graduation requirements. Full details are available in the Career Planning and Course Handbook. A few specific reminders follow:

- Required to earn a minimum of three years (three credits) of mathematics.
- Required to earn a minimum of three years (three credits) of science.
- Required to earn a minimum of three and a half years (3.5 credits) of social studies.
- Required to take a financial literacy course which can be fulfilled by any of the following courses:
 - Personal Financial Management – Business Education Course
 - Money Matters - Family Consumer Sciences Course
 - Economics - Social Studies Course
- Civics test is required in Wisconsin. The social studies teachers will be providing more information in class.

COURSE REGISTRATION MATERIALS

2023-2024 course registration materials will be distributed on **Monday, January 23, 2023**. Students will have 15 calendar days to determine their course selections. This process **concludes** on Advisor-Advisee Night, **Monday, February 6, 2023**.

COURSE SELECTION 2023-2024

The key to successful course selection begins with thoughtful planning. Parents, please take the opportunity to discuss career/work goals and aspirations with your son or daughter. Consider their interests, talents, and work habits. A visit to our outstanding Career Center can also make this exploration even more meaningful.

Wausau West offers a tremendous variety of course offerings. Please work proactively with your student to help select courses that support their interests, strengths, and areas of exploration. The Wausau West handbook is a very good resource for information on career planning and course descriptions. Parents and students will receive an electronic copy of this registration handbook during the week of January 23. We will also have this available on our Wausau West website. A limited amount of paper copies of this handbook will also be available in the Counseling office.

It is important to invest careful thought into this process, as later course changes and drops are done only if it meets criteria. Please refer to the registration dates on page 2 of this newsletter.



ACT Information for Juniors

Now that our school year is well underway, we thought it important to share an update on the Wisconsin State Assessment Program and how that program affects our juniors. We are sharing this information now to make you aware of our preparations and plans as they relate to the junior assessment, the **ACT exam**, which will be taken in March by all public school juniors in the state of Wisconsin. The ACT has typically been a college admission test for students interested in attending college following their high school career. Though it will still serve students interested in post-secondary education, it will also serve as an accountability measure for Wausau West.

This online test will be given on the morning of **March 7, 2023**. As we near the testing date, additional information will be made available to parents and students about timing, expectations, and preparation for this exam. Included are answers to frequently asked questions and the Wausau West ACT test preparation schedule.

ACT Frequently Asked Questions

<p>Is there a cost to parents/families for Juniors taking the tests on March 7, 2023?</p>	<p>No, the state will be picking up the cost.</p>
<p>What if my student already took the ACT, do they still have to take it on March 7th?</p>	<p>Yes, ALL Juniors in the state need to take the ACT test on March 7, 2023. The scores on the March ACT will also be used by each school for accountability purposes.</p>
<p>If a student chooses to take the test again, can he/she do it for free on the designated make-up day (April 11, 2023)?</p>	<p>No, all juniors will be tested only once by statewide testing protocol. If a student wants to re-test, the payment for the test will fall to the family and must be taken on national test dates.</p>
<p>Can students take the ACT test multiple times?</p>	<p>Yes, students can re-test at the family's expense.</p>
<p>What if my student is ill on March 7, 2023?</p>	<p>The make-up date is April 11, 2023.</p>
<p>Can a student's test score from the March 7, 2023 test date be used for college admission?</p>	<p>Yes it can, if you are testing under standard test administration or if you are identified as a special education student testing with ACT approved accommodations. Students using accommodations other than ACT approved will not be able to use their scores for college admission.</p>
<p>Can the student's test score be used for admission into a technical college?</p>	<p>Yes. For example, NTC uses the ACT scores and if a student has a composite of 18 or higher they will gain acceptance for admission into their college.</p>
<p>What if a student does not plan to go to a 2 or 4 year college, do they still need to take the ACT test?</p>	<p>Yes, the March ACT test score will be used for school accountability purposes.</p>
<p>How will colleges receive the scores?</p>	<p>When students fill out the pre-test information they will be able to select four colleges to receive their scores. Additionally, colleges will use the students' highest ACT test score.</p>
<p>Can I get more information on what types of questions are on the ACT?</p>	<p>Students can go to actstudent.org to find practice questions. <i>There will also be optional (but highly encouraged) subject specific sessions offered throughout the month of January & February to interested students. Additional resources are available on the Counseling website.</i></p>

The application window for local scholarships will be **February 10-22, 2023**. **Qualifying students will receive an email with a link to the online application when it becomes available.** Applications must be submitted by midnight on **Wednesday, February 22, 2023** with **NO EXCEPTIONS!**

All applicants must also participate in a ten-minute interview with the scholarship committee. Information regarding the student applicant is very pertinent to the committee in their task of scholarship selection. The scholarship committee consists of faculty members and counselors from Wausau West. Scholarships will be based primarily on academics, character, and school involvement.

Scholarships will be presented at the **Senior Awards Program on Wednesday, May 17, at 6:30 p.m.** in the auditorium.

College Credit Programs

Early College Credit Program/Start College Now

Interested in taking classes at UW-Stevens Point, Wausau Campus with the Early College Credit Program or Northcentral Technical College with the Start College Now Program while still a high school student? Please visit the [Wausau West Counseling website](#) for the appropriate application and eligibility information, and see your counselor for more information or clarification. Students must be in strong academic standing, and on track with West's graduation requirements. Both programs have strict application deadlines, and eligibility requirements. Not all students will qualify.

DEADLINES:

- Summer 2023/Fall 2023 semester - March 1, 2023
- Spring 2024 semester - October 1, 2023

AP Registration Timelines 2022-2023

PLEASE READ IF TAKING AN AP CLASS THIS YEAR

The following is a timeline of events that AP students should follow in order to participate in AP Testing in the spring. The cost will be \$100/exam if registered by November 1, 2022. Late registrations can be completed until March 14, 2023 with an additional \$40 late fee (\$140/exam).

- **Now** - students create a College Board account (myap.collegeboard.org) for access to curriculum materials and test questions throughout the school year
- **January 18, 2023** - Last day to request testing accommodations through the College Board
- **February 1 - March 1, 2023** - Students register and pay for 2nd semester classes (AP English Literature, AP Macroeconomics) through Total Registration
- **March 14, 2023** - Last day to register and pay in full for a year-long course with a \$40 late fee (\$140)
- **May 1 - 12, 2023** - AP testing. Schedule can be found [here](#)
- **July 2023** - Students access test scores through their College Board account

STUDENTS WILL BE ACCESSING AND UTILIZING TWO DIFFERENT WEBSITES FOR THEIR AP JOURNEY!

Step 1: COLLEGE BOARD



- myap.collegeboard.org
- Create a student account at the beginning of the school year
- Use Join Code from AP teacher to enroll in your class
- Receive activities, formatives, and practice tests assigned by AP teachers
- Designate whether you will be taking the AP test or not
- Information entered will produce a unique AP ID label sheet that will be used on exam materials
- In Summer 2023, students request free exam reports be sent to colleges
- In July 2023, students will log into their College Board account to see AP test results

Step 2: TOTAL REGISTRATION



- totalregistration.net
- Create a Total Registration account which includes parent information
- Register and pay for AP exams
- Receive administrative emails and texts sent to both parents and students regarding testing details, fees, etc.
- To avoid a late fee, students in full-year classes will register and pay in full (\$100/exam) by November 1, 2022
- Registration for full-year classes can be done up to March 14th with a \$40 late fee for a total of \$100 + \$40 per test

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) UPDATE

Wausau West offers 17 different AP classes which span a range of disciplines and interests. Advanced placement is a nationally recognized program that offers high school students exposure to college-level curriculum and the opportunity to earn college credit. According to apcentral.collegeboard.org, students who score a 3 or higher on an AP exam experience higher academic success than their non-AP peers and are much more likely than their peers to graduate from college on time.

Career Center

STUDENTS, CHECK YOUR EMAIL! Students are encouraged to check their Wausau School District email regularly to stay up-to-date on happenings in the Career Center. College, military, and community organization visitors will be announced via email and announcements. Additionally, job and volunteer opportunities and field trip announcements may also be sent via email.

COLLEGE & MILITARY VISITS: Representatives from colleges, universities, and the military will visit the Career Center throughout the year. Students should watch for advertisements and emails to learn when representatives will be in the Career Center, and make it a point to stop by the Career Center to learn more about their post-secondary options.

SELECTIVE SERVICE: All male students must register with the Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. Students may register as early as three months after their 17th birthday. This is not a school requirement, it's the law. Failure to register will affect a student's ability to receive financial aid, job training, or gain citizenship. Registering with Selective Service is easy and only takes about two minutes. Visit Ms. Pickar in the Career Center, go online at www.sss.gov, or pick up a registration card in the Career Center or at any post office.

Wausau West DECA membership is over 150 students and counting for the 2022-2023 school year. DECA prepares students to be academically prepared, community oriented and professionally responsible experienced leaders. Our tenth annual Trick or Can event on Halloween was an amazing success with 80 DECA members participating in this event giving back to the Wausau community. Attendance Updates

Students NEED to sign IN and OUT at the Attendance Window when they are arriving late to school (after 7:45 a.m.) and leaving early from school (before 3:00 p.m.). Including using your off campus privileges.

Communication between home and school is of utmost importance for the Attendance Office. The following is a list of acceptable reasons your student may miss school:

- Personal illness
- Funerals and religious services as requested by the parent(s) and/or guardian(s)
- Professional appointments that could not be scheduled outside of the regular school day
- Serious personal or family crisis
- Student is not in proper physical and/or mental condition to attend school in accordance with Wisconsin Statue 118.15(3)(a)
- Suspension from school

Students will be excused for the above reasons only when a parent/guardian gives an explanation of the cause of the absence. Please call the Attendance Office by 9:30 a.m. on the day of the absence. If this is impossible, please call or send a note with your child on the day of their return to school.

Parents/guardians are allowed to excuse their child for part of, or the entirety of, ten days per school year without a medical note. If your child is absent from school for more than ten days, you will be asked to furnish a medical excuse. Absences excused with medical notes are excused without using the ten days previously mentioned. Family vacations or activities must be pre-arranged through the Attendance Office prior to leaving. In such cases, the student must complete an Anticipated Absence form.



Microsoft Office Specialist Certification





Health Services

IMPORTANT: If your child is feeling ill during the school day, please have them report to the health office. We will contact you to make arrangements for them to be picked up or sent home.

Information regarding your child and illness.

Please follow these guidelines from the Wausau School District for illness:

Masks are optional within the Wausau School District, so if you prefer to send your child to school with a mask, you are more than welcome to do that.

Here's what else you need to know:

- If your child is sick (COVID-19 or something else), keep them home.
- If your child is showing COVID-19 symptoms, we recommend they get tested

We accept PCR, Rapid Antigen, and home tests.

- If the test comes back negative, they can return to school when they are fever free for 24 hours without medication and their symptoms are improving.
- If they test positive, we recommend that they quarantine for 5 days from their symptom onset. **So what does that look like?** The first day of their symptoms is considered **DAY 0**. Once **5 days** have passed, they are cleared to return to school on **DAY 6**. when they return, we recommend they wear a mask until **DAY 10**.

Reminders: All medication, prescription or over the counter, (i.e., ibuprofen, Tylenol, Tums, cold medication) must be kept in the health office during the school day. Students may carry emergency medication, inhalers and diabetic supplies. They also may carry cough drops, if needed.

Nutrition Services

Negative Meal Accounts

- School Messenger messages will be sent out to all households to let you know if your child's meal account balance is negative. Please send money with your child in a prepayment envelope that includes your child's name. This envelope can be given to the kitchen staff at your child's school. Parents may visit www.Paypams.com to create an online account for your child where you can add money to their meal account using a credit card as well as view purchases made.
- Middle School and High School: Ala carte privileges are suspended once the meal account goes negative, a reimbursable meal only may be charged on a negative account, until the account reaches a negative \$20.00; at which time the student will need to bring a cold lunch meal from home until the negative balance is corrected or cash is brought in to pay for the hot lunch meal that day. No student eligible for a free or reduced meal may be denied a lunch, even if the student has a negative account balance greater than negative \$20.
