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


94 students participated in the newly formed MMS Coding and Robotics Club last year. It was so popular that it became an elective course for 2015-16 and was financed with a grant from the Mason Schools Foundation.

# Finances

Being wise stewards of taxpayer dollars is important to Mason City Schools. We care about the partnership we have with our families and community to support our students' educational needs in an efficient manner, and are watchful of how much financial responsibility is borne by local taxpayers.



## Goal for Improvement:

Develop a Mason City Schools public policy advocacy network to support local control and financial stability.

In recent years, the State of Ohio cut Tangible Personal Property (TPP) reimbursement - hitting Mason especially hard. In seven years, Mason revenue increased 1.9% overall; Mason expenditures increased by 0% overall - due to many costsaving initiatives. Still, we will struggle to be "consistently great" if we continue to make cuts. The district has not passed an operating levy since 2005.



# Learning Environments

Part of having a great school system includes safe and inviting classrooms. Mason City Schools is grateful that the community has supported the district's facility needs. We have quality facilities that enable our schools to sustain the excellence that this community expects.
