## Counselor's Corner

December kicks off our focus on the character trait of **Service.** This time of year provides a real-time opportunity to shift one's focus outwards to the needs of others around us; To reflect on being self*less* instead of self*ish*. Let's be honest, with the holidays approaching, that can be a hard concept to grasp for our little people! It's perfectly normal if children need some help understanding the true intent of service and what it means to serve.

In the easiest terms, service is helping someone without expecting anything in return. It can be holding the door for someone as they are walking into a building. It could be donating canned food to food pantry. It could be taking the time to walk an elderly neighbor's dog for them.

Our gifts of service usually involve the sacrifice of something we have – time, resources, attention, energy, but almost always have a much greater reward. Last month, I met with 5<sup>th</sup> grade classes to teach about the power of one, how everything they do has an impact on those around them. I used a special science experiment to provide a visual to the lesson. It's an easy one that you can do at home: Milk and Food Coloring Science Project Together, we discussed the ripple effects of our behavior, and I challenged our 5<sup>th</sup> graders to make a positive difference. Imagine if each RME family chose just one act of service for the month of December. What an influence we could have on our community!

We had a wonderful turn-out for our Veterans Day First Quarter Assembly at the Ranch! Our students did a fabulous job honoring our Veteran guests with songs, letters, poems, and artwork. # CCPS Inclement Weather Policy

When inclement weather conditions occur, the decision may be made to delay the opening of school by one or two hours, to close school, or to dismiss school early. An announcement will be made for delayed openings or closing by 6:00 a.m. Every effort will be made to make the announcement as early as possible. The complete CCPS Inclement Weather Policy can be found here.

There may be an announcement made to open schools 2 hours late with a "re-evaluation" period to possibly close schools. If no re-evaluation announcement is made by 7:00 a.m., schools will open 2 hours late as originally announced.

All weather-related announcements will be made through the CCPS's School Messenger system, the school website <a href="www.carrollk12.org">www.carrollk12.org</a>, and CETV-Channel 21, as well as through local and regional media.

PLEASE NOTE: When schools are closed all day OR closed early, there will be no after school or evening events. This includes clubs, tutoring, meetings, planned special events, performances, and any Use of Facility arrangements.
