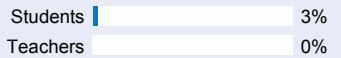

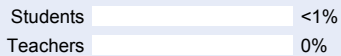

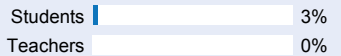

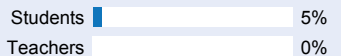

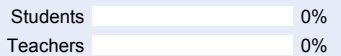

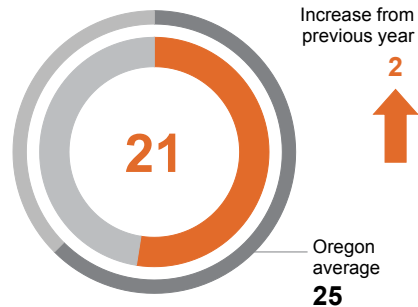

School Environment

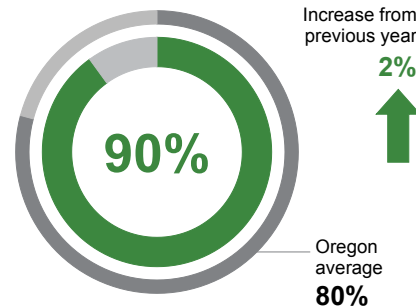
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

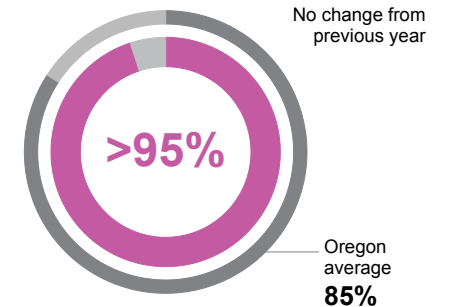
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

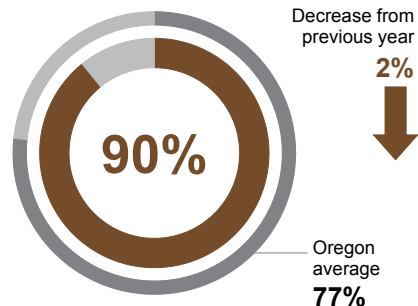
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.



Academic Success

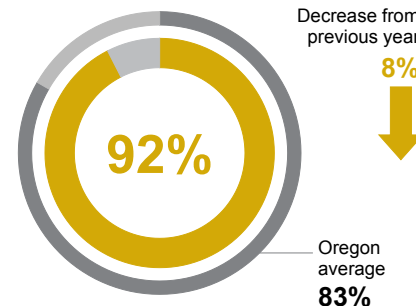
ON-TIME GRADUATION

School Goals

RHS is working to increase inclusivity and fostering an environment that promotes respect for all members of the learning community by utilizing PD time, student advisory, and parent meetings to build upon responsive practices that put people first. Our aim is to provide an environment where staff, students, and parents thrive both academically and emotionally. This environment will provide the ability to resilient, persistent, and take academic risks.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is working in partnership with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

District and school safety committees have been actively planning for increased security measures to keep students safe. This year we implemented a buzz-in entry system at a single point of entry. All other entries to the school are locked during the school day. This system brings added security to our building. We also continue to use the following safety procedures: a multi-agency threat assessment team, routine lock down and lock out drills, safety tip lines, connecting students with mental health services, staff training in run/hide/fight strategies, and partnership with our community resource officers.

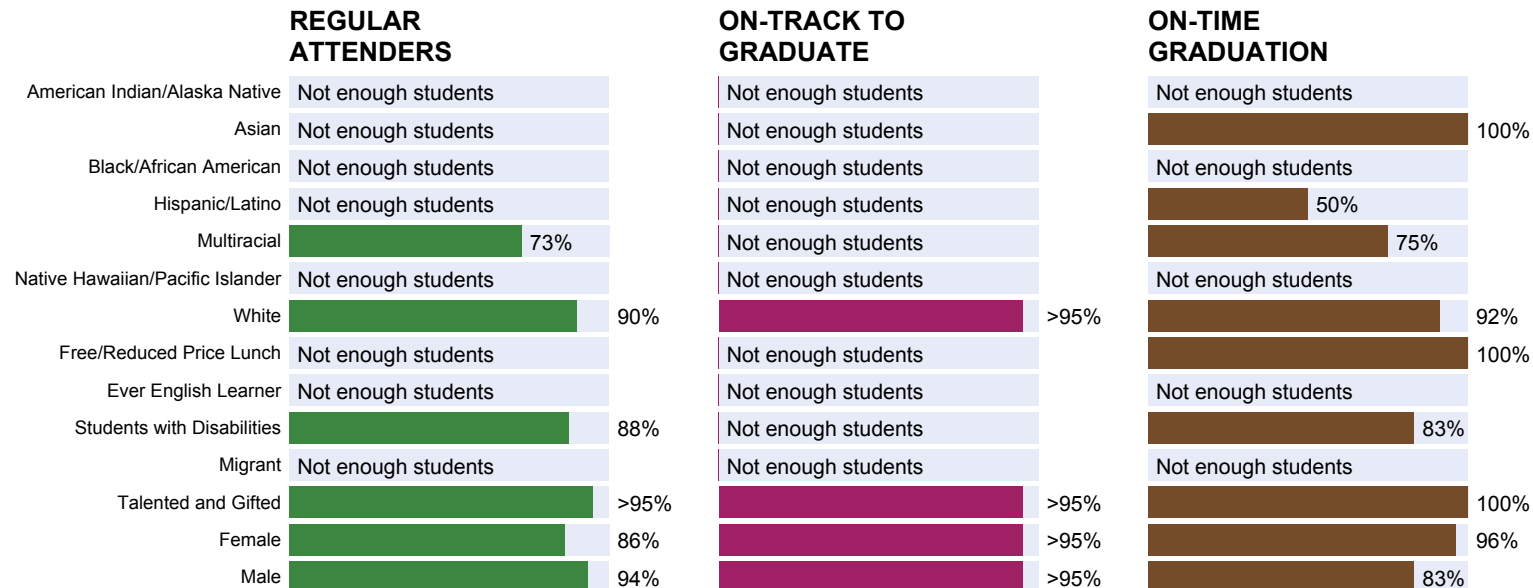

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

· RHS offers dual-enrollment courses for college credit with WOU, PSU & PCC. In our small high school, 116 students earned a total of 464 college credits in 2017-18.

· We offer the opportunity for students to take AP Exams at their request.

· Advanced French and Spanish, level 3, 4 & 5.

· Students are offered the opportunity to earn an honors credit in every core class and most electives.

· Students have the opportunity to participate in Templeton Scholars with Lewis and Clark College.
