Crestwood Safe Schools Helpline

Educating children in a safe environment is our top priority at Crestwood Local Schools. Fortunately, Crestwood is very safe and we have taken steps to assure this continues. Though reporting incidences should first be directed to a teacher, or administrator, we understand that this sometimes causes privacy concerns.

To alleviate this issue, Crestwood Local Schools, in partnership with the Mantua Police Department, has implemented a Safe School Helpline. This is designed to assist you in reporting any wrongdoing that impacts our schools or community - anonymously.

Whether it is a student who fears being called a "snitch"

by peers, or a resident who worries about vandalism in retaliation for reporting a crime, possession or use of drugs or alcohol, reckless driving, or any other illegal activity, Safe School Helpline provides the solution. This system is available 24/7 and may be accessed through a toll-free number, email, or text.

Your message will not be traced, nor will you be identified in any way. The Safe School Helpline team will transcribe your message and email this to the appropriate officials by the next school day. Emergency information will be relayed sooner.

CBI Program Prepares Students for Workforce



The Career Based Intervention Program (CBIP) at CHS helps struggling students make a smooth transition from middle school through graduation to most effectively attain their goals. The program provides at-risk freshman and sophomores as well as seniors appropriate academic intervention along with a work-based learning program.

When staffing allows, one teacher mentors at-risk freshman and sophomores and another teacher guides seniors. The program includes career related studies with one or more content areas with a CBIP teacher, and a paid or unpaid work experience depending upon scheduling. This allows students to earn up to four credits towards graduation.

CBIP Related is a course designed using Core Integrated and Academic Competencies (ITACs), which are employer-verified skills. These skills include: problem solving, communications, technology, responsibility, planning and management of career, and management of resources. To facilitate successful completion of all ITACs, a great deal of time is spent coordinating jobs outside of school, while working around athletic and activity schedules.

Students and instructors evaluate work experiences and offer guidance regarding issues and concerns as they arise both at work and in other academic classes. Additionally, students in CBIP may earn credit in a core subject area such as English or World Studies. The lessons challenge students to build on previous knowledge while continuing to follow common core standards as set by the state.

CBIP is much more than taking a class, earning multiple credits, and going to work. It's about higher expectations for students who are more than capable of great success after high school. It provides authentic learning opportunities by giving students the opportunity to apply knowledge acquired at school directly to the workplace. It provides students with support from teachers, parents, staff, and employers who work to the individual needs of each participant.

Students who participate in CBIP have a sense of belonging in a classroom of students who may not be identical to one another in thought, but who know one another well enough to want to celebrate special achievements together. These young men and women care enough to design a vision and pursue goals in the same way that they will make the world a better place when they graduate from Crestwood High School.
