EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN

GOVERNOR MIFFLIN STADIUM/MULTIPURPOSE FIELD

Emergency Personnel: Certified athletic trainer on call for practice, and on site for competition.

Emergency Communication: Working cell phone (coaches are to make sure cell phones are fully charged prior to start of practice or game).

Emergency Equipment: Medical kits at all practices and game. Other medical supplies (AED, splints, crutches) maintained in Governor Mifflin athletic training room or with athletic training staff.

Closest public AED to STADIUM: TWO AEDS IN THE STADIUM!! ALARM WILL SOUND

1. UNDERNEATH “RESTROOM” SIGN ON THE RESTROOM BUILDING BEHIND THE SCOREBOARD. ALARM WILL SOUND.
2. ATTACHED TO POLE BARN ALONG THE FARTHEST RIGHT GARAGE DOOR IF LOOKING AT THE STRUCTURE FROM INSIDE THE STADIUM.

Closest public AED to MULTIPURPOSE FIELD: IF LOOKING FROM ON THE MULTIPURPOSE TURF, AED is UNDERNEATH SET OF BLEACHERS TO THE RIGHT OF MIDDLE ENTRANCE GATE. ALARM WILL SOUND.

Roles of First Responders (This is the first person on the scene...coach, parent, athlete, athletic trainer):

1. Assess situation
2. Immediate care of injured or ill student-athlete/coach
3. Coach or other staff activate EMS
 - a. Dial 911 from cellular phone (provide name, address, telephone number; number of individuals injured, condition of injured, first aid treatment provided; specific directions; other information as requested).

NOTE: Please notify the staff athletic trainer(s) responsible for the team as soon as possible if he/she is not present.

4. Direction of EMS to scene
 - a. Address: **101 S. Waverly St. Shillington, PA 19607.**
 - b. Athletic trainer, coach or administrator will designate individuals to “flag down” EMS and direct to scene
 - c. Scene control: Sports medicine team will attempt to limit scene to first aid providers and designate coach/school personnel to move bystanders away from area

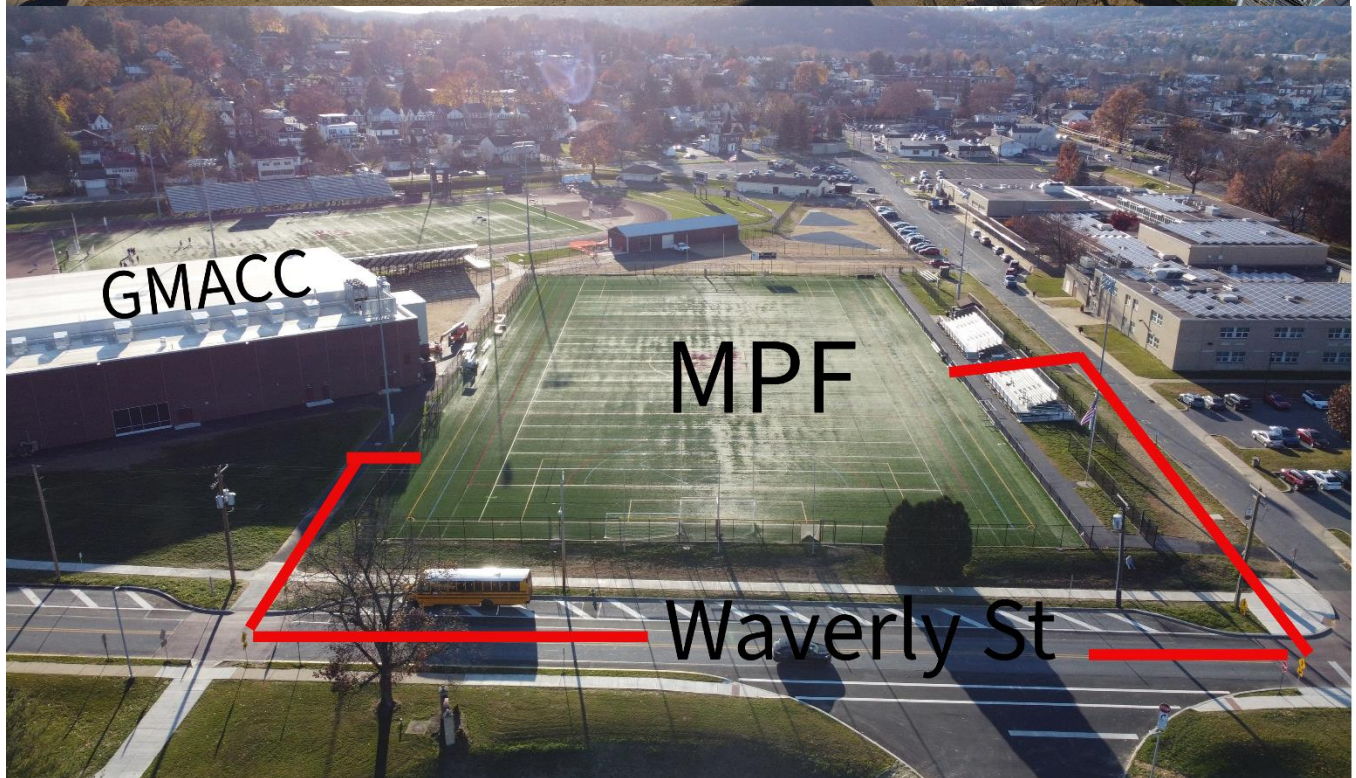
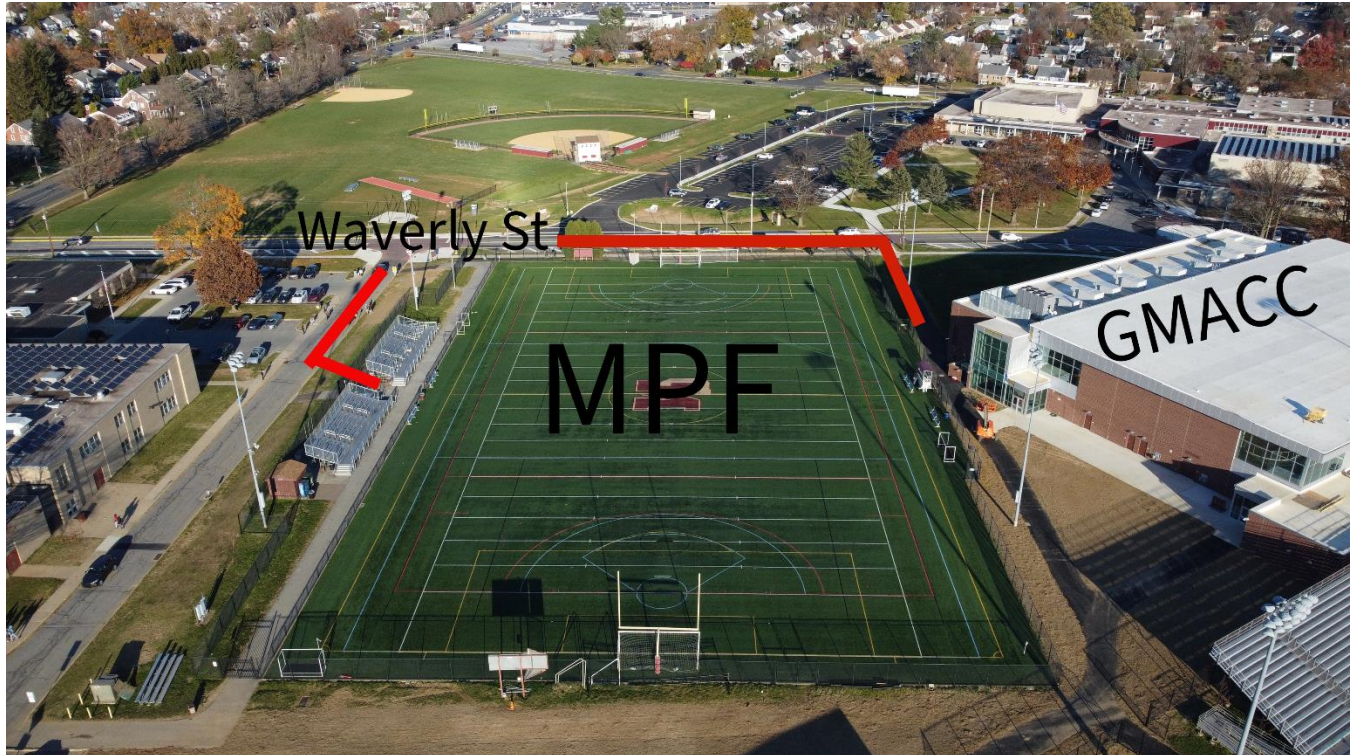
Venue Directions: DEPENDING ON WHERE EMERGENCY IS... EMS can enter at **SCOREBOARD** end of **STADIUM** gate through middle school’s entrance off of Waverly Street. Gate located to the left of the maintenance building in stadium. **Or** can enter at the **WAVERLY** side ENTRANCE ALONG THE FAR LEFT SIDE OF THE GMACC. located just across the street from the high school. Enter through black gates under small awning on LEFT side of GMACC. **MAKE SURE FLAGGERS ARE AT THE CORRECT ENTRANCE.**

EMS can enter **MULTIPURPOSE FIELD** gate through the middle school’s entrance off of Waverly Street (turn left into middle school from Waverly). **OR CAN ENTER AT THE MPF GATE CLOSEST TO THE GMACC (ON RAMP ACCESSABILITY)**

EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN: FRESHMAN FOOTBALL PRACTICE FIELD/THROWER'S AREA

Emergency Personnel: Certified athletic trainer on call for practice, and on site for competition.

Emergency Communication: Working cellular phone (coaches are to make sure cell phones are fully charged prior to start of practice or game.)

Emergency Equipment: Medical Kits with emergency cards at all practices and games. Athletic trainer will provide medical supplies for games (AED, splints, crutches, ice)

CLOSEST PUBLIC AED: VARSITY SOFTBALL PRESS BOX. ALARM WILL SOUND WHEN OPENED.

Roles of First Responders (This is the first person on scene...coach, parent, athlete, athletic trainer...)

1. Assess situation

2. Immediate care of injured or ill student-athlete or coach

3. Activation of emergency medical system (EMS)

a. Designate person to call 911(provide name, address, telephone number; number of individuals injured; condition of injured; first aid treatment provided; specific directions; other information as requested)

4. Direction of EMS to scene

a. Address: **101 S. Waverly Street, Shillington, PA 19607**

b. Athletic trainer, coach or administrator will designate individual to "flag down" EMS and direct to scene

c. Scene control: Sports medicine team will attempt to limit scene to first aid providers and designate coach/school personnel to move bystanders away from area.

Venue Directions: Access the **practice field** in the “outfield” of throwing area directly from Waverly Street or from the Governor Mifflin Senior High school parking lot. Access the **throwing area** directly from Waverly Street. Flaggers must be at either entrance ready to guide EMS.

NOTE: Please notify the staff athletic trainer(s) responsible for the team as soon as possible if he/she is not present.

Emergency Communication: Working cellular phone (coaches are to make sure cell phones are fully charged prior to start of practice or game).

Emergency Equipment: Medical kits with emergency cards at all practices and game. Other medical supplies (AED, splints, crutches) maintained in Governor Mifflin athletic training room.

**CLOSEST PUBLIC AED: AED 1(1ST FLOOR): BOX RIGHT OUTSIDE
ATHLETIC DIRECTOR'S OFFICE. AED 2(1ST FLOOR): BOX RIGHT OUTSIDE
WEIGHT ROOM AED 3(2ND FLOOR): BOX IN WRESTLING/MULTIPURPOSE
ROOM HALLWAY OF 2ND FLOOR**

2. Immediate care of injured or ill student-athlete/coach
3. Coach or other staff activates EMS

NOTE: Please notify the staff athletic trainer(s) responsible for the team as soon as possible if he/she is not present.

Venue Directions: Access the GMACC via Waverly Street and enter through the main entrance (glass windows and doors). Flaggers should be outside main entrance ready to guide EMS inside. Elevators inside main doors, go to hallway to the RIGHT.

CLOSEST PUBLIC AED: ON THE WALL TO THE LEFT OF THE OLD ATHLETIC TRAINING ROOM

Venue Directions: Access the gymnasium through the “auxiliary gym entrance” of the high school (entrance closest to the church). Enter high school doors numbered 21 or 20 and gym is straight ahead labeled “aux gym”. Flaggers must be at entrance to guide EMS.

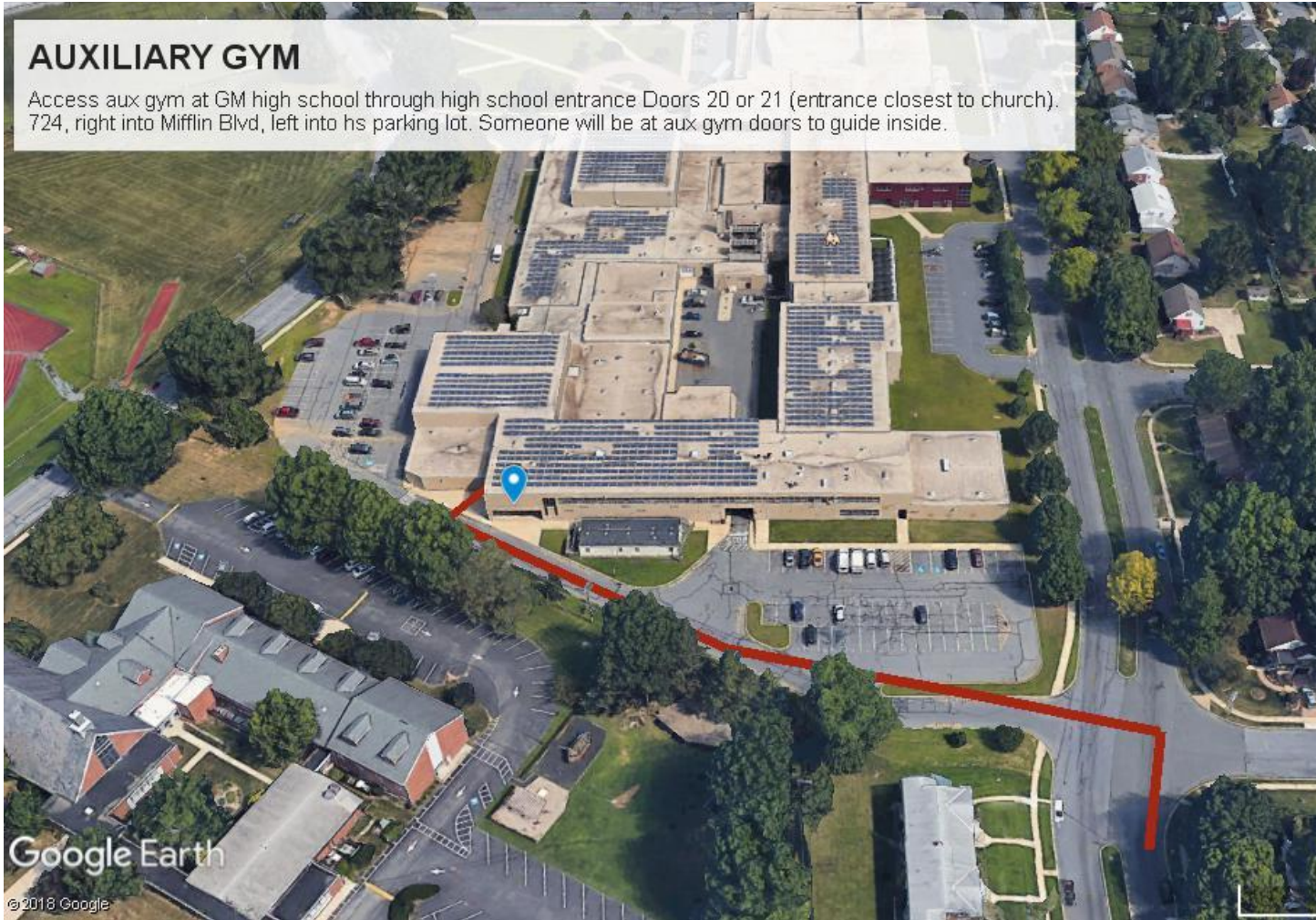

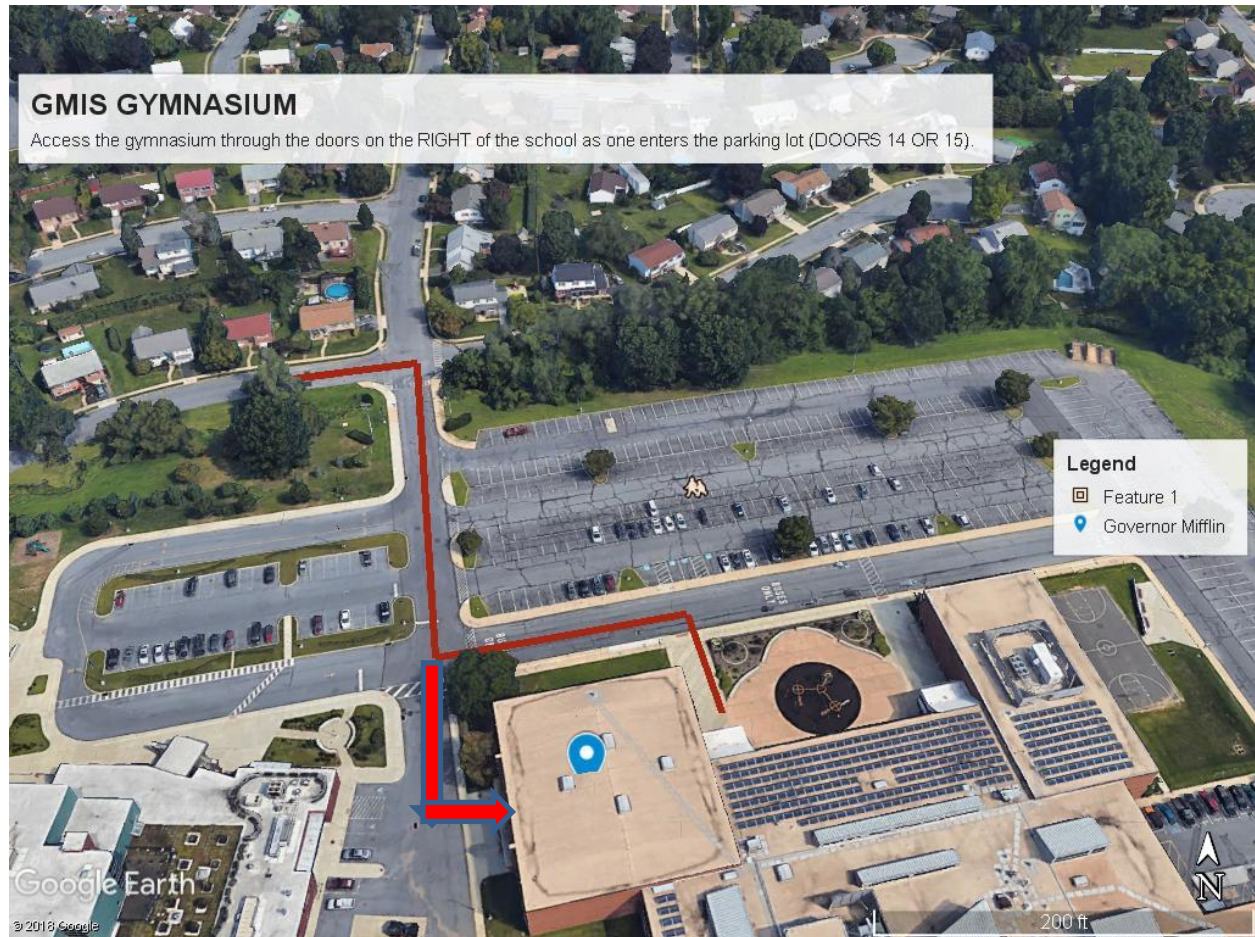

Venue Directions: FLAGGER’S JOB: EMS personnel will be directed from outside gymnasium to one of two sets of doors directly into gymnasium (will depend on where injured person is located inside)

1. Flagger will guide EMS to the row of maroon doors on the farthest RIGHT of the school as one enters the parking lot (side closest to elementary school).
2. Flagger will guide EMS through maroon door just BEFORE the RIGHT main lobby entrance doors (doors 14-15).
3. Flagger will guide EMS through main entrance doors on RIGHT side of the school (doors 14-15).
