### MINOR OFFENSES

- Chewing gum
- Cheating/plagiarism
- Defiance
- Disrespect
- Disruption
- Dress code violation
- Inappropriate language
- Peer conflict (physical/verbal)
- Public display of affection
- Prohibited items
- Property damage
- Technology violation
- Tardies (between classes)
- Other (staff discretion)

### MAJOR OFFENSES

- Bullying/harassment
- Excessive cheating/plagiarism
- Excessive defiance
- Excessive disrespect
- Excessive disruption
- Excessive technology violation
- Fighting/aggressive behavior
- Hate speech
- Possession of alcohol/drugs/vapes
- Possession of weapons
- Profanity/rude/obscene gestures/vulgarity
- Sexual harassment
- Theft
- Threats
- Truancy
- Vandalism
- Other (staff discretion)

### MINOR CONSEQUENCES

- Verbal**
- Warning(s)/redirection
- 1-2 Minor referrals**
- Infractions will be recorded in SWIS
- 3-6 Minor referrals or 5+ tardies**
- Lunch detention with student reflection
- 7-11 Minor referrals or 10+ tardies**
- After school detention with student reflection
- Major referral or 12+ minor referrals, or excessive tardies**
- Placed on check-in/check-out
- Progressive Discipline**
- Saturday school, class suspension, school suspension

### MAJOR CONSEQUENCES

- Teacher referral**
- Teacher writes referral by end of day (call office if escort needed)
- Meet with administrator**
- Administrator meets with student within a reasonable time frame
- Appropriate consequence**
- is assigned and recorded into SWIS
- Potential interventions**
- behavior contract
- community service
- conferences
- check-in/check-out
- detention
- suspension
- counseling
- expulsion

**PARENTS** will be notified by an email from their student when a lunch detention is served

**PARENTS** are encouraged to have meaningful conversations with their student about behavior

**STUDENTS** will receive verbal notification from their teacher when a referral is entered into SWIS

**BEHAVIOR DOCUMENTATION** will reset at the end of each semester
