Haldane Musicians Represent at NYSSMA Area All-State

This year, five Haldane students were selected to perform at the New York State School Music Association (NYSSMA) Area All-State Festival. Maya Gelber participated in the treble chorus, Oliver Petkus and Kira Drury participated in the mixed chorus, and Robert Freimark (principal clarinet) and Oscar Donahue (percussion) performed with the Area All-State Band. Students were accompanied to the festival by Jessica Stein and Sam Sauer.

During the Area All-State Festival students from Putnam, Dutchess, and Columbia counties rehearsed together for two days and then performed a concert at the end of the weekend.







Haldane Model UN Heads to UCMUN

Haldane's Model UN sent twelve students to the University of Connecticut Model United Nations to work with students from around the globe

Each November, hundreds of high school students gather at the UConn Storrs campus for a weekend of engaging in substantive debate, participating in realistic committee simulations, and learning from their fellow delegates.

On Saturday, the participants met with their committees on a broad range of social, economic, and political topics. Then, after a long day of debates, they formed resolutions on their committee's assigned issue. A delegate dance was held that evening. Sunday, the groups passed their final resolutions and awards were given.

UCMUN's mission is to create committees that appeal to all types of delegates, no matter their experience level. Students are pushed to heighten their understanding of the international system through different simulations, ranging from standard UN committees like the UN General Assembly to crisis simulations of regional organizations and political organizations.


