

Our Community Located adjacent to Oakland, CA, the City of Alameda has approximately 79,174 residents. The local area includes UC Berkeley, CSU East Bay, and the College of Alameda, our local community college. The median household income is \$106,737 per US Census Bureau. The top 3 employers in the city are Exelixis, Penumbra, Inc and Alameda Alliance for Health.

Our Students The student body reflects the demographics of the ethnically and socio-economically diverse East Bay Area. ACLC embraces its diversity and seeks to foster ways of further diversifying the student body. It is an open and accepting learning community where all students, regardless of background or personal identity, feel safe, cared for, and supported. All students receive an outstanding education that prepares them for college and a career.

ACLC, one of two public charter high schools in Alameda, is a 4-year high school with an enrollment of just 356 students.

The ethnic/racial make-up of our student population is 11% Black/African American, 1% American Indian or Alaskan Native, 16% Latino/Hispanic, 34% Asian/Pacific Islander, 28% White/European American, and 10% Multiracial. Roughly 17% of our students are classified as limited English proficient. 27% are eligible for free and/or reduced price lunch.

Academics ACLC's curriculum is democratic & project based. Learners are given project periods during which they build organization and time management skills. To provide our learners with challenging course opportunities and programs that we cannot offer (sports, theater, music, etc.) partnerships have been

made with the local district, and our students are encouraged to take classes at community college.
