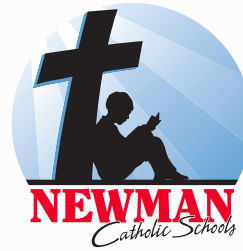

# Scholarships & Endowments



**Newman Catholic Schools is blessed by the support of many parishes, organizations, foundations, friends and alumni who choose to establish scholarships to assist students in funding their education. During the 2014-15 school year, \$92,600 was awarded to students from all grade levels. Scholarships are awarded by committee selection.**

## Scholarships Established in 2014-2015

**Randy Juley Memorial Scholarship:** The Randy Juley Memorial Scholarship was founded to celebrate an 8th grade NCS student planning to attend Newman Catholic High School. For 20 years, Randy dedicated himself as a Newman coach and substitute teacher. His dedication to the system spurred family and friends to honor him through continued support of students.

**Jim and Mary Kay DeBroux Scholarship:** Members of the graduating class of 1963 established the scholarship to provide tuition assistance to an 8th grade student planning to attend Newman Catholic High School. The scholarship was named in honor of Jim and Mary Kay DeBroux, two dedicated Newman alumni and former faculty members.

**Mark and Kerry Fehrman:** Mark and Kerry Fehrman are the owners of Rib Mountain Paper, and parents to a 2006 graduate and current student at NCS. Their success as small business owners is the driving force behind development of the scholarship; awarding two seniors with ambitions to earn a business degree through a postgraduate education.

**Thomas Connolly Memorial Scholarship:** Thomas Connolly was a man of deep faith and an avid supporter of NCS. # State of NCS

## Annual Fund

Each year, NCS parents make the choice to provide their children with a Catholic based education. Parents invest in the system's mission through tuition, but there is a widening gap between tuition revenue and the true cost of providing an outstanding education. In the 2014-2015 school year, that difference equaled \$2,300 per student. To help bridge the gap, funds are raised through the system-wide Annual Fund and applied to operating costs. We want to thank the hundreds of donors that generously gave of themselves to help Newman Catholic Schools fulfill their mission. Through the selflessness of current parents, past parents, grandparents, alumni, faculty and staff, corporations, and friends in the community, NCS raised \$153,000, 75% of the overall goal.



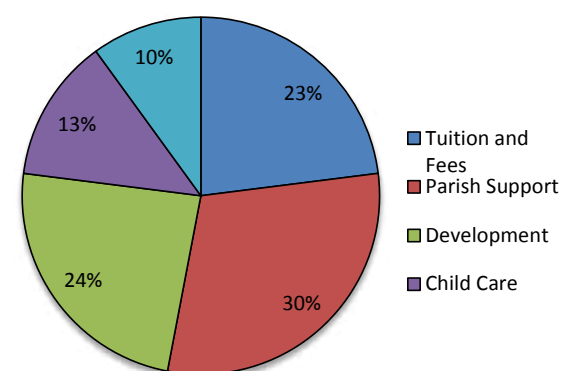
## Income and Expenses

Newman Catholic Schools had four primary income sources in the 2015 Fiscal Year. As of the end of May, Parish support and Tuition and Fees were the largest contributors to the operating budget; followed closely by fundraising efforts, both system wide and site/club specific. Besides all fundraising initiatives, the "Development" funding source would also include all monetary and in-kind donations. The fourth income source is Child Care, a significant contribution due to the 400% growth in enrollment at the two child care sites that would not have been possible just five years ago.

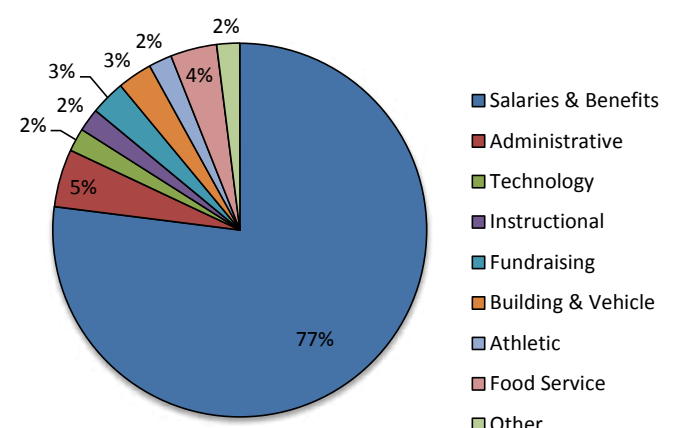
To complete the reconciliation, it is important to recognize the primary expense outlays. In doing so, Newman is able to ensure that they are being good stewards of their resources; working to streamline processes and limit overspending. Salaries and Benefits continue to be the primary expense on an annual basis at 77%, with the remaining 23% spread evenly over all other operating expense categories.

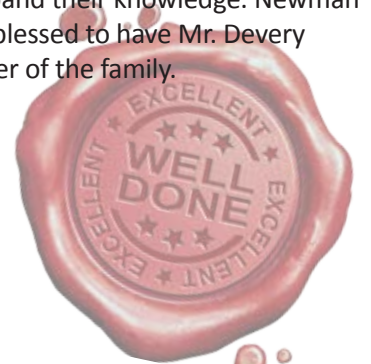

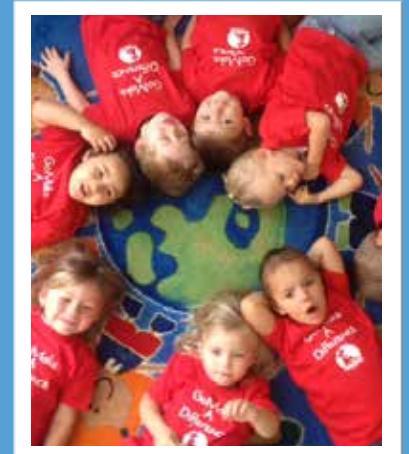
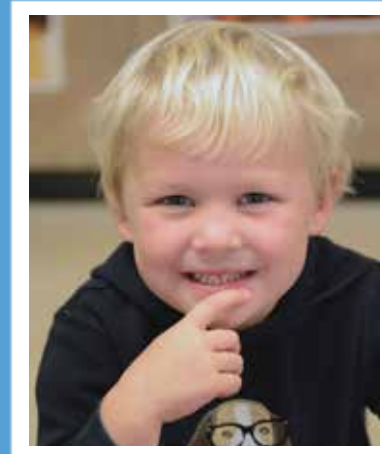
# Back to School
