Step one was to receive reaccreditation status through AdvancED; which the system has achieved through June 30, 2021 when evaluation will again occur. In the report out by AdvancED, NCS was directed to address five areas of concern, the most important being the development of a strategic plan.

To fulfill the need for a strategic plan, NCS has contracted with Partners in Mission (PIM), the leading professional services firm engaged in advancing the mission of Catholic education. PIM will assist with the collaboration required to develop a strategic plan, to help us grow enrollments and continue the ministry and mission of delivering Catholic education. The PIM Strategic Planning Process is a mission driven, collaborative and participative method that develops the institution's goal statements and preliminary objectives through analysis of the school's present and future environment. The process takes into consideration major resources available to the school system, both human and financial.

Over the summer, the NCS Executive Committee will cultivate key members needed to lead the efforts focused on the following areas or domains:

- Mission / Catholic Identity
- Ownership / Governance / Administration
- Relationship to larger community
- Facilities
- Enrollment
- Program / Curriculum / Technology
- Finance
- Advancement / Communications
- Alumni Relations
- Staffing

As we enter our 134th year of delivering the ministry of Catholic Education, please give serious consideration to joining the strategic planning efforts. Your contribution of time and talent in this process is a crucial step in fostering collaborative development. 

*“Teachers have three loves: love of learning, love of learners, and the love of bringing the first two loves together” - Scott Hayden*


The teachers of Newman Catholic Schools are the backbone of the system; they choose to share their faith and wisdom with the future leaders of our Catholic community. To become a teacher is to choose a career filled with passion. Passion for the knowledge they have to share and passion for the students they lead. The love and dedication teachers show their students is evident through the personal sacrifices they make. It is not a rare occurrence to witness a teacher personally funding needs for their classroom and students, or covering expenses for professional development. Their sacrifices were the driving force behind development of the ICare Grants in 2014. The grants became available as an offering of assistance to help fund professional development needs.

The grants are fully funded through donations raised during the fund-a-need portion of the Winter Wonderland benefit auction. In 2014, the first ICare Grant push raised a remarkable \$35,000. The funds helped fulfill teachers’ development needs for two years, through the end of the 2015-2016 school year. Exhaustion of the funds called for a renewal of the fundraising efforts; fulfilled during the 2016 auction when a staggering \$50,000 was raised in support of the teachers.



Funds raised support the operating budget and help offset the \$2,800 gap between tuition rates and the true cost of educating a child. True costs are based on the costs associated with system operations; compensations, curriculum, facility maintenance, safety and security, etc. Donations made to the system support operations and help maintain tuition rates.

## Income and Expenses

### **Income:**

At the close of the 2017 fiscal year, the system continues to have four primary income sources; tuition and fees, parish support, child care, and Advancement respectively. Child care consists of the income earned from enrollment of the six week – 4K programs. Our youngest programs continue to enjoy the strongest growth rates and act as a feeder into the elementary schools. Advancement contributions focus on all fundraising efforts, both system wide and site/club specific, monetary and in-kind donations, and estate gifts.

### **Expenses:**

As witnessed in the accompanying graph, the greatest expense continues to be salaries and benefits at 68% with the remaining 32% spread evenly over all other operating expense categories. Having strong revenue streams is not enough if the system does not act as good stewards of its resources. Through continued analysis and streamlining of processes, NCS avoids overspending and maintains profitability.

- NCHS: Physics students built trebuchets to learn about projectile motion.


