As we begin our 32nd year as a unified Catholic school system, I am happy to report that Newman Catholic Schools (NCS) is a rock-solid institution with an exceptional brand, deeply held traditions, and prominent presence in its community. It is also with great joy that this year we are able to celebrate our namesake, Cardinal John Henry Newman's canonization to saint on October 13, 2019!

As we look to the future, it is with excitement that I share the ongoing strategic planning process will soon come to fruition with a formal rollout this fall. Strategic planning efforts have taken a deliberate and disciplined approach to ensure all Newman Family constituents were engaged in the process. This past spring, planning efforts culminated with the conclusion of public and parish-focused listening sessions that allowed stakeholders to lend their voices to the planning efforts.

After the restructuring in 2004, she went to St. Michael and taught 4th grade for 6 years. She finished at St. Anne where she taught second grade for another 9 years. She was blessed to help hundreds of students in their sacramental preparation, and she enjoyed seeing second-generation families going through the Newman System and into her classroom.

For 39 years, Mrs. Wagner dedicated herself to the education of students from grades 3-8 at St. Therese, St. Michael and St. Mark; teaching a total of 750 students during her tenure. Mrs. Wagner leaves a legacy in which she challenged her students to think outside the box while embracing knowledge and their faith.





Casa Hogar Mission Trip 2019

St. Francis Xavier Catholic Church & St. Paul Catholic Church Mosinee, WI



On June 17th, the parishes of St. Francis Xavier and St. Paul in Mosinee kicked off the 2019 mission trip to Casa Hogar Juan Pablo II in Lurin, Peru. Based on the Boys Town method, Casa Hogar was founded by Fr. Joe Walijewski in 1986 to offer a safe and loving environment in which at-risk children are given faith, family and a chance for a promising future. At this time, 64 children call Casa Hogar their home. Supporting Casa Hogar has been a part of the Diocese of La Crosse's mission outreach with many of the schools and parishes raising funds and gathering donations to support the youth who live there. The parishes of St. Francis Xavier and St. Paul have expanded their support by developing a wonderful opportunity in which area youth can travel to Casa Hogar and complete much needed improvement projects. This year, two of our Newman family members, Lauren Nowinsky and Jaida Heinz, were blessed to be able to join the Mission Trip. As witnessed by Lauren's thoughts below, their experience was life-changing.



Our journey to Peru started with a prayer service with family and friends at St. Francis Xavier Parish. We departed shortly after and


began our travel day to Peru!



Our service project on this trip consisted of raking large leaves and dead grass on the grounds of Casa. We then tilled a garden with rakes and pick axes. After our landscaping was done, we shoveled sand out from under rocks on the mountain behind Casa and swept the dirt road that leads to Fr. Joseph Walijewski's tomb. Yes, we swept a dirt road! After the road was swept, the group painted railings on top of the orphanage house where the families do their laundry. The fresh coat of paint looked great!

We got up every morning to go to church at 6:15 with everyone at Casa. The kids play the guitar and sing for mass which was always a great way to start our day. Mass was in Spanish and by the end of the week we were able to say some of the responses!

Most of us were hoping to go to Peru and change the lives of the people there, we found it very humbling that the people at Casa changed our lives more than we could ever imagine. The endless love and laughter that filled Casa is something that will not be forgotten by anyone who experienced it. The love and happiness present there and among the people in Peru is something our group was shown constantly. It was very eye opening to see that with so little, their faith in God is so strong.



ATHLETIC BOOSTERS



Thank you to the Booster Club!

For almost three decades, Newman Catholic Schools Athletics has been blessed with the support of an active group of parent volunteers known as the Booster Club. The Booster Club supports all athletic programs from grades 4-12.

The current club design was founded in the early 1990's as the St. Matthew Athletic Committee. Though the committee supported all sports offered to grades 5-8, the primary focus was to enhance the existing basketball program. The early years were led by a dedicated group of supporters; including, Dale Skrzypchak, Al Romportl, Gary Koy and Sherman Gress. When St. Matthew became the middle school, the Athletic Committee began working in partnership with the high school athletic department to further develop the programs and develop a

feeder network. To help raise funds, the Booster Club has implemented several fundraising

events. One of the most successful (and the longest running), the Gus Macker 3-on-3 tournament. Gus Macker began in 1990 and ran successfully for 22 years; generating thousands of dollars to NCS Athletics and significantly more for the local community. Gus Macker was a labor of love that required year round planning and preparation.

Though Gus Macker is gone, the Booster Club's efforts have never diminished, simply shifting to focus on two primary fundraisers, Cabin Fever in April and Swingfest in July. Booster Club also runs a recycling program and sells discount cards to increase donation revenue.

Funds raised by the Booster Club ensure students in grades 4-12 are able to participate in the sports they love. Though much could be added to this list, here are initiatives/projects funded by the Booster Club:

- St. Matthew specifically: installed glass backboards, refinished the gym floor (added a 3-point line), and built a concession stand
- Purchasing of uniforms and equipment
- Busing to games
- Updated gym bleachers
- Remodeling of the locker and weight rooms
- Resurfacing of the outdoor track

The Newman Catholic Schools family wants to thank the parent volunteers who ensure the athletic programs remain successful. Their efforts are truly appreciated.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Thank you to the families of Mary T. Carlson and Thomas Jablonski for supporting the students of Newman Catholic Schools through the establishment of memorial scholarships in honor of their loved ones are awarded through a committee selection process.

Marilyn T. Carlson Scholarship: Mary T. Carlson was born in 1924 in Salisbury, England. She was an adventurous child, always trying to keep up with her older brothers. She attended an all-girls parochial school where she excelled at Latin, French, history and geometry. Mary's world changed forever when England entered World War II in September of 1939. Over the course of the next seven years Mary's family opened their home to strangers fleeing the bombing in London. It was during these years that her faith in God anchored her – seeing her through rationings, air raids, and the death of a beloved brother in action. It also instilled in Mary a sense of hospitality, volunteerism and gratitude for every day and everyone she met. After finishing school she worked as a nurse's aide in a military hospital. When the war was over Mary traveled to Medford, Wisconsin to visit her sister. She met and married her husband Richard and lived in Wisconsin for the rest of her life.

The strong educational and faith-filled foundation of Mary's childhood and interest in others continued into adulthood. She was a lifelong learner, reading and remembering anything she could get her hands on, making connections with whomever she encountered. Mary valued and listened to the stories of everyone that she met and she welcomed them, prayed for them, and invited them to church. "Grandma Mary", as she was known to her Kallstrom grandchildren, Nick '05, Allie (Jones) '08 and Luke '11, took an extensive interest in her family's education and was always available to help with homework and research projects. Before there was Google there was Grandma Mary, a walking encyclopedia who would share her knowledge in a humble and encouraging way with the hope of inspiring others to develop their own gifts to share. Mary's family honors her legacy through the creation of the Mary T. Carlson Memorial Scholarship, assisting students in fulfilling their dream of receiving a Catholic education.

<u>Jabolinski Scholarship</u>: Ask an alumni of Newman Catholic Schools about Mr. Jablonski and you will hear about a wonderful, gentle, and compassionate teacher who taught with enthusiasm and passion.

Mr. Jablonski was born May 23, 1931, in Chicago, Illinois, to Thomas and Mary Jablonski. February of 1963, he married Margaret Gross in Stevens Point. Thomas and Margaret shared 55 faith filled years together, surrounded by their six children and 17 grandchildren. Before teaching, Mr. Jablonski served his country in the U.S. Army. After leaving the Army, he taught at the former St. James Catholic School and later at Newman Catholic High School. While at Newman, he taught religion, Latin and English. He also ran the Drama Club, directing many productions. Within the community, he was a supervisor with the Wausau Park Department Pools, a volunteer coordinator at Marathon County Social Services, active in Community Theatre and served as the Assistant Leader for the St. James Boy Scouts. He was active at St Mary's Catholic Church as a lector and cantor.



Margaret and Tom believed strongly in the importance of Catholic education, sending their own children, Paul, Lisa, David, Barbara, John, Mary and Gaylord, through the Newman system. Upon Mr. Jablonski's passing, it was not a difficult decision for his family to begin a memorial scholarship in his name. Doing so ensures his legacy will live on in support of students continuing their education with Newman Catholic High School.



Income and Expenses

The ability to succeed in the mission of delivering excellence in education in a Catholic environment is only possible through dedicated analysis and maintenance of the system's budget. With the support and guidance of the Finance Committee, Newman Catholic Schools continues to meet its financial goals; allowing for necessary capital improvements, curriculum & technology advancements, and faculty support through implementation of the "Just Wage" initiative. The system is focused on ensuring teachers are paid fairly; supporting their passion and sacrifice.

When discussing the system's budget, there are key areas to highlight and how those areas affect budgetary strength:

Income:

The system has four primary income sources: tuition and fees, parish support, Advancement, and child care respectively. Child care consists of the income earned from enrollment of the six week – 4K programs. Advancement contributions focus on all fundraising efforts, both system wide and site/club specific, monetary and in-kind donations, and estate gifts.

Expenses:

As witnessed in the accompanying graph, the greatest expense continues to be salaries and benefits at 72% with the remaining 27% spread evenly over all other operating expense categories. Having strong revenue streams is not enough if the system does not act as good stewards of its resources. Through continued analysis and streamlining of processes, the goal of maintaining profitability is fulfilled.

Newman Cardinal Fund:

Formerly known as the Annual Fund Drive, the Newman Cardinal Fund again surpassed its goal by reaching 112%. As of July 1, 2019, the fund reached \$225,386.90. This is exciting news as all donations go to support the operating budget. It took over 150 supporters to achieve success. Thank you to the system's many benefactors.






